### *The Business of the Church*

As a refresher, the charge conference, as defined in the UMC Book of Discipline ¶ 247, is the connecting link between the local church and the general Church and shall have general oversight of our Leadership Team. At the Charge Conference, held annually, the administrative business of the Church is discussed and the necessary reports are approved by the members in attendance and submitted to our District Superintendent, Rev.
