

## Luke 4 & 6 - Two of Jesus' Sermons

1. The account of Jesus' **FIRST SERMON** comes at the beginning of his public ministry. Read **Luke 4:14-15**. How was his ministry being received in Galilee?
2. According to **Luke 4:16-22**, how did the people in the synagogue at Nazareth react to the start of his sermon?
3. **Isaiah 61:1-2** is the text for his sermon, and the basis for his work. It promises to bring . . .

  - \_\_\_\_\_ If you going to call me "Lord," you better do what I tell you!
  - \_\_\_\_\_ Four woes for those who are rich, full, happy and well spoken of.
  - \_\_\_\_\_ A house built without a foundation will get washed away.
  - \_\_\_\_\_ Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.
  - \_\_\_\_\_ A good-hearted person does good; an evil-hearted person does evil.
  - \_\_\_\_\_ Three blessings for those who are poor, hungry and sad.
  - \_\_\_\_\_ A blind person can't lead another blind person; they'll both fall in the ditch.
  - \_\_\_\_\_ A special blessing for those of you who are hated because of Jesus.
  - \_\_\_\_\_ A house built on a good foundation won't get flooded out.
  - \_\_\_\_\_ Love your enemies, and treat others as you want them to treat you.
  - \_\_\_\_\_ Good trees don't produce rotten fruit, and vice versa.
  - \_\_\_\_\_ Don't judge and condemn others; rather, forgive and be forgiven.
