GENESIS 6-9 - NOAH & THE FLOOD

Many ancient traditions include stories about how the gods tried to destroy humankind with a great flood, for example, the Enuma Elish myth and the Gilgemsh epic, both from Mesopotamia c. 2000 BCE. The Bible's version is carefully structured to show a movement from judgment to grace.

- _____ Noah cursed Canaan, and blessed Shem and Japheth.
- _____ A month later the earth was dry, and God told Noah's family to leave the ark.
- _____ Noah planted a vineyard, and got drunk drinking the wine, and lay around naked. _____ God remembered Noah, stopped the rain, and he flood waters went down.
- _____ The Lord promised never again to curse the ground and destroy all living things.
- _____ A third time Noah sent out the dove, but it did not return.
- _____ God told Noah he would make a covenant with them, never to send a flood again.
- _____ Noah's three sons and his grandson Canaan would be the ancestors of all people.
- _____ All the animals, creeping things and birds left the ark in family groupings.
- _____ Noah sent out a dove, which returned because the waters had not gone down.
- _____ Ham saw Noah's nakedness, and his brothers Shem and Japheth covered him up.
