1. Read all of **Luke 22:1-71** and number these events in their correct order.
 - _____ The disciples gather with Jesus to eat the Passover meal.
 - _____ Jesus finds his disciples sleeping.
 - _____ Guards blindfold Jesus, beat him up, and make fun of him.
 - _____ On the Mount of Olives Jesus prays he will not have to "drink this cup."
 - _____ Judas accepts a bribe to betray Jesus to the religious authorities.
 - _____ Jesus says the disciples' leader should be like a servant.
 - _____ A rooster crows when Peter says a third time he doesn't know Jesus.
 - _____ Jesus (almost) admits he is the "Son of Man" who will sit beside God.
 - _____ Angels help Jesus as he sweats drop of blood.
 - _____ Jesus tells Peter and John to follow a man with a water jug.
 - _____ Peter sits around a fire and tells a girl he doesn't know Jesus.
 - _____ Jesus tells Simon he will be tested, and he will deny Jesus three times.
 - _____ Peter and John prepare the Passover in a large upstairs room.
 - _____ One disciples cuts off a man's ear but, Jesus heals him.
 - _____ Jesus takes another cup of wine and says, "This is my blood."
 - _____ The disciples argue about which of them is the greatest.
 - _____ The leaders ask Jesus if he is the "Messiah," the "Son of God."
 - _____ Jesus tells Peter and John to prepare their Passover meal.
 - _____ The religious leaders plot how to get rid of Jesus.
 - _____ Jesus takes a cup of wine and tells the disciples to share it.
 - _____ Jesus allows his disciples to take two swords with them.
 - _____ Judas leads a crowd to Jesus and kisses him.
 - _____ Jesus looks at Peter, who then runs outside and cries.
 - _____ Jesus takes some bread and says, "This is my body."
2. Reread **Luke 22:19-20**. Passover celebrated the exodus of God's people from enslavement in Egypt, and looked forward to the coming of a Messiah. How did Jesus bring new meaning to this traditional meal?

3. Read **Luke 22:24-27** again. What does it mean to say that the most important should be like the least important, and that the leader should be like a servant? How was Jesus like a servant-leader?

4. Look at **Luke 22:31-34 & 54-64** again. Summarize what happened. Has there ever been a time when you were afraid to stand up for something of someone? How did you feel?

5. Finally, read **Luke 22:39-45** once more. What concerns did Jesus have for his disciples? In what ways do you face similar dangers?

6. What does Jesus pray for himself? How might your life change if you pray to seek God's will rather than your own?
