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| 1.    | 1 John differs in style form Paul's letters. Look at the beginning and end of 1 John and compare it with Philippians, for example. What's different? Is 1 John a letter? Or some other literary form?  |
| 2.    | 1 John does not possess a typical introduction or conclusion, but it does contain some interesting clues that it was written to address a specific circumstances where some group of people departed from the traditional teachings about Jesus Christ. Look at 1 John 20-26; 4:1-2. What does the author stress as true beliefs? How does the author think you can identify true Christian from those who follow false beliefs? |
| 3.    | 1 John tells us our true identity. According to 1 John 3:1, who are we? Does this make a difference in how we see ourselves? How we see others?  |
| 4.    | According to 1 John 4:16b, what is the main characteristic by which we can know God? When, then, should be the main characteristic by which others know that we know God?  |
| 5.    | A key verse, 1 John 3:18, tells us it is important that our words match our actions. Read also 1 John 4:7. What happens when, as Christians, our actions do not reflect our faith and beliefs?   |

| 6. | Read 1 John 1:8-9. When we sin, what should we do? What promise do we have from Jesus? Have you ever seen or heard these words before? |
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| 7. | Read 1 John 3:16-18 and 1 John 4:19-21. What commandment are we to follow? How do we know Jesus loves us?                              |
| 8. | So, how committed do you want to be to your Christian faith? How many things are moiré important to you than your love for God?        |
