3rdJohn – Problems in the Church

A certain church leader, called A, was having trouble. He would send out a group of traveling missionaries, called C, to make the rounds and preach from one church to another. But in one of those churches was a scoundrel, named D, who wouldn't cooperate. Whenever C came to his church, D would refuse to let them come in. If anyone else in that church tried to help the missionaries, D would kick them out. To make matters worse, D was even saying bad thing about A. So to try to straighten things out, A wrote a letter to B. He knew that B was a good man, someone who always helped C when they came to visit. In fact C had told A about the warm welcome C had given them. The Elder wanted B to welcome another traveler, named Ewhen he came.
