**Day 1- Thursday, August 30<sup>th</sup> GLASGOW**

**BD**

Arrive into Glasgow Airport and meet with our executive coach and driver. Enjoy a Glasgow **city sightseeing tour** before continuing to **Glasgow Botanic Gardens**. Located in the heart of the city's West End by the River Kelvin, the gardens contain a variety of plant collections, woodland copses and riverside walks as well as the famous Kibble Palace- a magnificent glasshouse containing tree ferns and plants from tropical rainforests.

**Day 2- Friday, August 31<sup>st</sup> THE TROSSACHS & LOCH LOMOND**

Depart Glasgow and travel northwest via the **The Trossachs National Park**. We'll experience the magic of Loch Lomond's magnificent scenery on board a cruise before continuing to **Inverary Castle**- the ancestral home of the Duke of Argyll, Chief of the Clan Campbell. The gardens here cover sixteen acres and form one of the most important designed landscapes in Scotland.

**Day 3- Saturday, September 1<sup>st</sup> ISLES OF MULL & IONA**

This morning, we'll travel by ferry from Oban to Craignure, **Isle of Mull**. The Isle of Mull is the large Inner Hebridean island nestled close to the western mainland and the third largest island in Scotland. Enjoy the stunning scenery as we travel across the island to visit **Duart Castle**. This castle proudly guards the sea cliffs of the island and enjoys one of the most spectacular and unique positions on the West Coast of Scotland. Brought back from ruin in 1911, the castle treasures 800 years of history of one of Scotland's oldest clans, the Macleans, and is one of the last surviving privately-owned Clan Castles in Scotland.

Continue across Mull to Fionnphort for the foot passenger ferry to **Iona** where we will visit the abbey and nunnery. Iona is a holy isle and has been described as the birthplace of Christianity in Scotland. St Columba and 12 companions came here from Ireland in AD 563. The monastery they founded was one of the most important and influential in the British Isles. Late afternoon ferry back to Mull and Oban.

**Day 4- Sunday, September 2<sup>nd</sup> GLENCOE TO ISLE OF SKYE**

This morning we depart Oban travelling north to **Ardchattan Priory Gardens**. A garden has existed here for over 700 years since Valliscaulian monks, from a little-known order in Burgundy, first settled here. With its monastic ruins and beautiful views across the loch, this tranquil spot hosts herbaceous borders, a rockery, ornamental trees and a woodland garden.

Continue to **Glencoe**- a place of history, wildlife, adventure and myths. These mountains were formed through violent volcanic eruptions, and then sculpted by massive glaciers. Fingal, the legendary Celtic hero, is said to have made his home among these towering mountains, while his poet son, Ossian, found inspiration in the landscape. Enjoy the wonderful Scottish scenery as you travel to the Isle of Skye.

**Day 5- Monday, September 3<sup>rd</sup> ISLE OF SKYE**

This morning we'll visit **Dunvegan Castle & Gardens**- the oldest continuously inhabited castle in Scotland and the ancestral home of the Chiefs of Clan MacLeod for 800 years.

Afterwards, enjoy an afternoon driving tour of the **Trotternish Peninsula**- a hilly 50-mile circuit round the northernmost peninsula on the Isle of Skye with fabulous views over the sea in all directions.

**Day 6- Tuesday, September 4<sup>th</sup> LOCH NESS & CLAVA CAIRNS**

Morning departure from the Isle of Skye and travel to Drumnadrochit for a visit to **Urquhart Castle**. Once one of Scotland's largest castles, Urquhart saw great conflict during its 500 years as a medieval fortress. Control of the castle passed back and forth between the Scots and English during the Wars of Independence and up until the 1500s. The last of the government troops garrisoned here during the Jacobite Uprisings and blew up the castle when they left. Urquhart's iconic ruins remain, offering glimpses into medieval times and the lives of its noble residents.

Travel via the shores of Loch Ness to **Clava Cairns**- a well-preserved Bronze Age cemetery complex of passage graves and standing stones in a beautiful setting.

**Day 7- Wednesday, September 5<sup>th</sup> CULLODEN BATTLEFIELD & CAWDOR CASTLE BD**

Today we visit the **Culloden Battlefield**. On April 16<sup>th</sup>, 1746, the final Jacobite uprising came to a brutal head in one of the most harrowing battles in British history. Jacobite supporters, seeking to restore the Stuart Monarchy to the British throne, gathered to fight the Duke of Cumberland's government troops. It was the last pitched battle on British soil, and in less than an hour, around 1,500 men were slain – more than 1,000 of them Jacobites. The richly researched and stimulating Culloden Visitor Centre features artefacts from both sides of the battle and interactive displays that reveal the background to the conflict.

Continue to the magical **Cawdor Castle & Garden**. Steeped in history and stunning views, the castle and garden dates back to the late 14th century.

**Day 8- Thursday, September 6<sup>th</sup> LEAULT FARM & PITLOCHRY B**

Travel south via the Cairngorm Mountains to **Leault Farm** where we'll enjoy a 45-minute demonstration amidst some of the most beautiful scenery in Scotland. We'll see up to eight dogs working as a team maneuvering sheep and ducks through various obstacles.

Continue to Pitlochry for a guided tour of **Edradour Distillery**. Renowned as the smallest and most picturesque in Scotland. Visitors see intimately how the making of this handcrafted 'Water of Life' remains a living tradition in the twenty first century.

**Day 9- Friday, September 7<sup>th</sup> DRUMMOND CASTLE & SCOTTISH CRANNOG BD**



**Drummond Castle Gardens** is one of Europe's and Scotland's most important and impressive formal gardens. Dating back to the 17th century, the gardens were redesigned and terraced in the 19th century. The formal gardens that you see today were replanted in the 1950s, but preserve many of the original features, including the ancient yew hedges and the remaining beech tree planted by Queen Victoria. Visitors are welcome to visit the gardens, although the castle is closed to the public.

This afternoon we visit the **Scottish Crannog Centre**- a unique reconstruction of an ancient loch dwelling in the heart of beautiful Perthshire. Discover what life was like 2,500 years ago.

*Overnight Pitlochry*

**Day 10- Saturday, September 8<sup>th</sup> HIGHLAND GAMES & THE KELPIES**

Today we experience the **Pitlochry Highland Games**- traditional events such as Caber Toss, Tug of War, Wrestling as well as Highland dancing and a Pipe Band. Don't forget your kilt!



Depart Pitlochry and travel south to Edinburgh with a stop at the **Kelpies**- 30-metre-high horse-head sculptures, standing next to a new extension to the Forth and Clyde canal, and near River Carron.

**Day 11- Sunday, September 9<sup>th</sup> EDINBURGH**

Morning visit to the **Edinburgh Royal Botanic Garden**. Comprising 70 acres of stunning scenery, the Royal Botanic Garden Edinburgh captures the imagination of everyone who visits. Reflecting the international research and conservation work of RBGE, the garden is home to the largest collection of wild-origin Chinese plants outside China. Other points of interest include the Scottish Heath Garden, recreating the plantings and landscape of the Scottish highlands, the world-famous Rock Garden, which is home to over 5,000 alpine plants, and the 165m-long Herbaceous Border, backed by an outstanding century-old beech hedge. This afternoon, enjoy an **Edinburgh city sightseeing tour**.

**Day 12- Monday, September 10<sup>th</sup> EDINBURGH**

Today is a completely free day to explore the sights. World class museums, castles, historic walks and shopping are just a few of the experiences that Edinburgh has to offer.

**Day 13- Tuesday, September 11<sup>th</sup> HOME OR SCOTTISH BORDERS**

This morning we transfer to the airport for the return trip home or travel south if continuing on to the Scottish Borders tour.
