

2018 CLTAWA STATE CHINESE WRITING COMPETITION

THEME: 我的世界 Wŏde Shìjiè (My World)

Examples: My Family, My Pets, My Hobbies, My Life, My Trip, My Friends, etc.

RULES & CONDITIONS: A maximum of **6** entries permitted from each primary, secondary and community schools with more than 200 students. Schools that have both primary and secondary students may submit 6 primary entries and 6 secondary entries. Schools with less than 200 students may submit a maximum of 3 primary entries and 3 secondary entries. All entries must have an entry form securely attached to the back. The entrant's school name must not be on the work or in the text. Entry forms must be endorsed by the teacher as student's original work with true and accurate information (e.g. age, category, years and level of study). Entries without the teacher's signature of endorsement and parent's signature of consent to publish their child's entry will not be judged. Language used should reflect the years of Chinese study.

- Each entry must have a TITLE and must not exceed a single side of A3 size paper.
- No lift up flaps or booklets as judges will only look at the work without touching it.
- The number of characters used must be accurately counted and stated on the entry form.
- Marks will be deducted if the number of characters is more or less than the given range.
- ALL entries MUST be handwritten by students without tracing.
- Only one entry per student, either from their Community School or Day School and not both.
- Student's Chinese language teacher must be a current financial member of the CLTAWA to be eligible to enter.
- Entries will only be accepted from students who attend a Day School with a Chinese language program or students who attend a Chinese Community School. Entries from private students will not be accepted.

PRIZES: Trophies will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners in categories with sufficient entries. Medals will be awarded to 4th and 5th place winners in categories with sufficient entries. Certificates of Excellence will be awarded to other outstanding entries.

The judges' decisions are final and no correspondence will be entered into regarding the result.

CLOSING DATE: Wednesday, 29th August 2018

Entries posted or personally delivered after Wednesday, 29th August 2018 will not be accepted.

Winners will be announced at the 2018 State Mandarin Speaking Competition on 15th September 2018.

JUDGING CRITERIA:

- Content: The writing must reflect the student's chosen title, written creatively with appropriate structure and development. It must not exceed the maximum number of characters title and punctuation not counted. (10 marks)
- Language: Correct use of characters and/or pinyin with correct tone marks, sentence structure and punctuation. Students are encouraged to use characters. (10 marks)
- **Presentation:** Neatness and creativity (5 marks)

DET, AISWA, CEWA SCHOOLS (Non-Chinese & Students with NO Chinese family background)

THEME: 我的世界 Wode Shijiè (My World)

Category A: Years 3 and 4

Written text using characters and/or pinyin (between 35 - 45 characters/pinyin – title and punctuation marks not counted). The use of language can be in the form of short written texts, conversations or speech bubbles.

Category B: Years 5 and 6

Written text using characters and/or pinyin (between 55 - 65 characters/pinyin – title and punctuation marks not counted). The use of language can be in the form of descriptive texts, written texts, conversations or speech bubbles.

Category C: Years 7 and 8

Written text using characters and/or pinyin (maximum of 95 - 105 characters/pinyin – title and punctuation marks not counted). The use of language can be in the form of descriptive texts, written texts, conversations or speech bubbles.

Category D: Year 9 and 10

Written text using characters (between 115 - 125 characters – title and punctuation marks not counted). The use of language can be in the form of narrative texts (fiction or non-fiction).

COMMUNITY SCHOOLS and ALL STUDENTS with CHINESE BACKGROUND from DET/AISWA/CEWA SCHOOLS

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Category E: E1 - Levels 1&2 / Beginner

- E2 Levels 3-5 / Lower Intermediate
- E3 Levels 6-8 / Upper Intermediate

E4 - Level 9 / Advanced

Category E1: Levels 1&2 / Beginner

Written texts using characters and/or pinyin (between 135 - 165 characters/pinyin – title and punctuation marks not counted). The use of language can be in the form of descriptive texts, written texts, conversations or speech bubbles.

Category E2: Levels 3-5 / Lower Intermediate

Written text using characters (between 225 and 275 characters – title and punctuation marks not counted). The use of language can be in the form of descriptive texts or narrative texts (fiction or non-fiction).

Category E3: Levels 6-8 / Upper Intermediate

Written text using characters (between 405 - 495 characters – title and punctuation marks not counted).

Category E4: Level 9 / Advanced

Written text using characters (between 540 - 660 characters – title and punctuation marks not counted).

Judges reserve the rights to reclassify entries to the appropriate level
