Wings of Shelter Confronts Modern Day Slavery

Modern day slavery – in the form of human trafficking – affects 27 million people around the world. That slavery can take the form of forced labor or commercial sex. And the state of Florida ranks third, after only California and Texas, in the number of reported cases of human trafficking based on calls to the National Human Trafficking Resource Center Hotline. These were only a few of the many facts shared by Hillary LeMaster, executive Director of Development for Wings of Shelter, during a presentation April 17, 2017, in the sanctuary of First UMC of Bonita Springs, which was sponsored by the United Methodist Women.

Following the presentation, the Bonita Springs UMW unit presented a \$200 check to Wings of Shelter to support the important work the organization is doing. Wings of Shelter is a non-profit organization which has a local presence in Lee County. The local group was organized in 2008 and is based in Estero. It is the “first long-term residential service for trafficking victims” in the state, according to Ms. Le Master. There are now several other facilities in Florida which are licensed by the Florida Department of Children and Families. The local group is licensed as a “long-term group home” where minor victims can remain up till 18 years of age. Wings of Shelter maintains two “safe houses” in the county to serve minor female victims.

Human trafficking is “here in our backyard”, according to Ms. Le Master. The speaker pointed out that this is “domestic” human trafficking. Her organization is not dealing with foreign adults brought into the country to be exploited either by forced labor or commercial sex. Estimates show 100,000 American kids are victimized through prostitution, pornography, or stripping. The Human Trafficking Resource Center at Florida Gulf Coast Center serves a seven-county area. It reported 14 cases in 2013; the reported number grew to 38 cases in 2015.

The speaker shared that there is no single profile for victims – not by race, ethnicity, physical description or size. She said that traffickers “can create a vulnerability for victims” through their recruitment tactics. A common misconception is that victims are physically restrained. More often, emotional or psychological abuse is used to control the victims. Since minors under 18 years of age cannot legally consent to sex, the fact that some “may seem willing” is not relevant. Many of the victims do not self-identify or ask for help because they incorrectly believe the “trafficker” is caring for, providing for, and loving them. Many come to Wings of Shelter because they have been involved with law enforcement, been removed from abusive home lives, or been placed with child welfare agencies.

The goal of Wings of Shelter is to rescue victims and “begin the restoration process through a victim’s centered, non-punitive approach in our Safe Houses.” While girls are in the program, the organization works “to empower and encourage our girls academically, emotionally, spiritually and socially to help them heal from the complex trauma they have endured and move toward independence.”

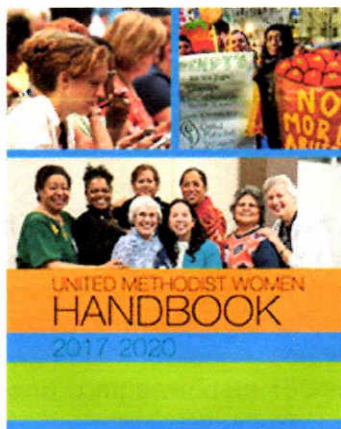

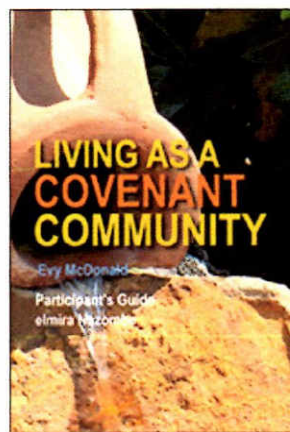

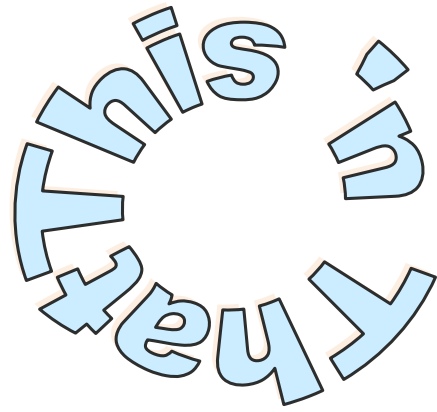
