Greetings Sisters in Christ,

"She is clothed in strength and dignity and she laughs without fear of the future."

Proverbs 31:25

As we begin the month of May, we remember there is a special holiday called "Mother's Day" which we celebrate every second Sunday. On May 8, 1914 President Woodrow Wilson signed this into law after much persistence and a great deal of groundwork done by Anna Jarvis who originally wanted to honor her mother. Her mother's name was Ann Reeves Jarvis who was a founder of Mothers' Day Work Clubs. She was a social activist, defined by her faith and very active within the Andrews Methodist Episcopal Church community. During one of her Sunday school lessons in 1876 her daughter Anna Jarvis allegedly found her inspiration for Mother's Day during a closing prayer:

I hope and pray that someone, sometime, will found a memorial mothers day commemorating her for the matchless service she renders to humanity in every field of life. She is entitled to it.

– Ann Reeves Jarvís

The symbolism of the white carnation was described by Jarvis as:

"Its whiteness is to symbolize the truth, purity and broad-charity of mother love; its fragrance, her memory, and her prayers. The carnation does not drop its petals, but hugs them to its heart as it dies, and so, too, mothers hug their children to their hearts, their mother love never dying. When I selected this flower, I was remembering my mother's bed of white pinks."

In the 1920s prices of white carnations increased, and the floral industry introduced the red carnations to meet demand for the flower as Anna Jarvis' original symbols began to become re-appropriated, such as the red carnation representing living mothers and the white carnation honoring deceased mothers. She attempted to counter these commercial forces, creating a badge with a Mother's Day emblem as a less ephemeral alternative to the white carnation. She spent her later years and money trying to rescind the holiday, but was unsuccessful. She was placed in a sanatorium late in 1940s paid for by the greeting card and floral companies. Although she never married or had any children, she paved the way for children today to honor their mothers.

In today's world we have all types of women who, whether or not they have had children, have been in loving and mothering situations with the people in their lives: aunts, cousins, teachers, nurses, doctors, pastors, co workers, friends...so, if there is that special "mother" in your life, please wish her a "Happy Mother's Day" and let her know how much you treasure her!

RED BIRD MISSION

Founded in 1921 in the Cumberland Mountains of SE Kentucky to provide education and Christian Evange-lism ministries to residents of the area. It was born in answer to a prayer. It is a story of gracious outpouring of prayer and means by the church. The first school building was completed at Beverly in January 1922. Soon after teachers came, nurses and doctors arrived. In 1968 The EUB merged to become The United Methodist Church. The Work Camp Involves approximately 2500 volunteers annually and now help repair Community homes. The hospital operated until 1986 when closed for economic reasons. In 2000 Red Bird Clinic opened as an outpatient clinic. They have a community store and a crafters market through ministry.

Since the 1990's the Communities Out Reach ministries serve the elderly and families. Emphasis on family food production led to the Farmer's Market in 2010. The first new home was built in 2016 by volunteers. Today the need remains critical in this area of chronic poverty, lack of jobs, poor housing and rugged mountainous terrain. Red Bird Mission is currently facing a financial Crisis.
