





Units in Action



Good Shepherd United Methodist Women, North Fort Myers, FL.

Every year, the Good Shepherd United Methodist Women in North Fort Myers turn a weekend marked nationally by massive consumer consumption into a local weekend of caring. The group of about 20 women have held an annual "Souper Bowl of Caring" on the weekend of the Super Bowl, to benefit the Harry Chapin Food Bank, since 2008. They stand at the church doors at 2951 Trail Dairy Circle as people exit after each service, and collect donations for the food bank in large soup pots.

They are an example of the many donors to the food bank who show their support year after year in smaller ways that make a big impact. They include various clubs, church or community groups, school groups, small businesses and others. Their continuing support is priceless.

The Souper Bowl of Caring is actually a nationwide movement started back in 1990 by a church youth group. "They prayed that we'd be mindful of those without a bowl of soup to eat on that day," said Beth Ferris, social action officer for the Good Shepherd United Methodist Women, who coordinates the Souper Bowl of Caring. Eventually the movement expanded nationwide to include schools, businesses and other groups, she said. They each hold an event in the weeks or days leading up to the Super Bowl, then give 100 percent of their donations to a chosen local charity.

"Everyone has so many snacks and things on Super Bowl Sunday, we were thinking about food for the hungry, and couldn't we do something on that day for people who are hungry," Ferris said.

"Snacks and things" is an understatement. The National Retail Federation's annual survey showed spending on the 2018 Super Bowl was expected to exceed \$15 billion in food, beverages, team apparel and accessories. In the meantime, the total raised by the 2018 Souper Bowl of Caring was \$18.1 million, through the efforts of 3,719 different groups.

At Good Shepherd United Methodist Church, they raised \$1,420 for the Harry Chapin Food Bank. They know their efforts make a difference. "We're small but we're mighty," said Lois Jean Wood, a member and past president of the women's group.

During the church service, information about the Harry Chapin Food Bank and who it serves is provided to the congregation, and information about the food bank is also in the church's newsletter.

"I'm sure (the congregation) are more aware of what Harry Chapin is doing because of this collection," Wood said. "I think we generate the enthusiasm and the congregation generates the cash," Wood said.

In the 11 years the group has been contributing the proceeds from Souper Bowl Sunday to the food bank, they have raised about \$13,760, Ferris said. In 2014, the nearby Sunseekers RV Park Church began adding to the church's donation to the food bank. "One of Good Shepherd's members conducts the service at the park and they wanted to help the Harry Chapin Food Bank also," Ferris said.




Sarasota Trinity UMW

Mission u – Reflection: July, 14th, Saturday morning, just at dawn looking out over the court yard at Bethune-Cookman University I read the following devotion for that very day from "For the Beauty of the Earth: Daily Devotions Exploring Creation" featuring watercolor paintings by Kathrin Burleson:

"Use your peripheral vision," our Tai chi instructor tells us. We need to be aware of each other's movements in order to achieve a smooth and continuous pace through the form. This is what birds do, he explains, when they fly in a flock – each one is aware of the birds on either side so they move in perfect unison.

You have watched videos of – or perhaps seen in real life – clouds of birds that appear seemingly out of nowhere, wheeling, swooping, soaring, diving – great streamers of birds sweeping across the sky in perfectly choreographed dances.

The entrancing movements of a murmuration of starlings, or flocks of other migrating birds, involve more than simple eye contact. Scientists think that two factors make the birds' coordinated movements possible. The first is each bird's ability to sense quickly the movements of other birds. The second is a constant transfer of leadership – as a lead bird becomes tired, the bird drops back and another takes the place in front.

As the Body of Christ, we are Jesus' flock, and we too need the ability to move in the world as a single organism. We can learn from the birds to be intensely aware of our sisters and brothers, sensing the direction of their movements and taking turns in leadership by not allowing a leader to become so weary that the progress of the whole flock slows. Who are the people in your life whose movements you see and match? Is it your turn to lead or to drop back and let someone else move forward? This way of being begins with peripheral vision – really seeing each other – and becomes a soaring dance as we move together toward God's dream for all creation. By Mary W. Cox


