Greetings Sisters in Christ,

"All they asked was that we should continue to remember the poor, the very thing I had been eager to do all along." Galatians 2:10

"In the early 1970's Indiana businessman Richard Dugger led a group of high school students on a visit to Haiti and was deeply moved by the plight of people in developing countries. He and others made personal commitments to share their time and resources. They prayed and dreamed of ways to help meet the needs that they had seen. Other Christian laymen and clergy from Indiana and Florida caught the dream, and ECHO (Educational Concerns for Haiti Organization) was born."

In June of 1981 Dr. Martin Price became the executive director and the work in Haiti was closed. However, all of ECHO's resources were directed towards strengthening the work of other organizations and under his direction ECHO has become an ever-growing pipeline for sharing information, ideas, techniques, methods, plants, books, materials...whatever has the potential to ease world hunger. ECHO's primary functions are providing agricultural information to overseas workers, distributing seeds for promising food plants, and offering training opportunities at the Florida farm. ECHO's role and purpose as conceived in the early 1980's endures today, and as a result, ECHO's "history" is mostly a story of the expanding ministry. ECHO.Echocommunity.org connects over 12,000 small-scale farmers and those working to eliminate world hunger with essential resources and each other.

On September 15th we had eleven units with 51 attendees go to see the work of ECHO in action. It was a sunny and hot day, but we had three great tour guides taking us around the grounds to learn a little about the types of plants that are grown and studied to best provide the needed food in areas of the world that have depleted resources. Thanks go out to Joyce Shelso, Social Action Coordinator and Phyllis Jackman, District Treasurer as well as Sandra Barton who helped make the event go smoothly and trouble free. Hopefully we all got to go back to our Units and share what we learned about this vital mission whose social action follows our scripture above where we are asked to continue to show our love by remembering the poor.

As your Units are starting back up after the long hot summer, we ask that you attend our Annual Meeting on October 13th in Cape Coral to celebrate your accomplishments over the past year as well as to elect and reconfirm our 2019 slate of officers. This year we will also be hosting our Mission Sampler on November 17 th in Venice where you will learn techniques of holding your own mission and spiritual growth studies. Look for the registration in next month's Sojourner. You are also invited to the Conference Annual Meeting on November 3rd in Lakeland. Information and registration form are in this newsletter.






