We are being given an opportunity to be better stewards of our Mission Giving dollars. So here we are, 2018, being presented with new concepts and new choices for our United Methodist Women Reading Program and BOLD ENRICHMENT RESOURCES.

There is no longer a printed catalog of the Reading Program category books. The catalog is available on line - <u>www.unitedmethodistwomen.org</u> - under the "members and leaders" tab and then select the "reading program" drop down. Books will no longer be available at events. Literature and other free items will be displayed on the Program Resources table at events to enrich your Unit programs. The books from the five categories in the Reading Program are to be purchased through Amazon – smile.amazon.com and a designation of United Methodist Women will yield a .5% donation from Amazon. Barnes & Noble and Cokesbury are also sources for the books listed on this year's Reading Program. Your public library is also a source. If your unit has an Amazon Prime member, shipping would be free!

United Methodist Women publications of Mission Studies, membership reference books such as the Handbook, Gifts/Promotional Items, Mission Giving resources, Program Planning Resources {Prayer Calendar, Program Book, etc.} and Assembly 2018 items are all available through the "Shop" tab of the United Methodist Women website coming from the Program Resource Center located in Georgia. A cost effective way to cover shipping would be to place an order as a Unit sharing the shipping and handling costs. Greetings to my District SPR Sisters in Christ!

As most of you know, a lot of changes have been happening regarding our Reading Program and I am writing today to update you on what I have been told from our National Division. As I convey this to you, please bear in mind that more changes will be occurring over the next few weeks and months, so please keep in touch with your District SPR for those updates.

The decision to eliminate the consignment process was not easy, nor was it taken lightly. The consignment conversation has taken place for years. Our National Division tried to correct and perfect the process, but it did not help. It became clear to National that continuing consignment was costing more energy and funds than expected. It just became necessary to make the change.

What was accomplished were the following:

- a. Recent unsold books were returned to the publisher, without much penalty.
- b. Books were donated to women's shelters.
- c. Books were donated to prisons and jails.
- d. Books were donated to national mission institutions.
- e. The Korean Network received some donated books.
- f. Some went to Regional Missionaries.
- g. All books from the Assembly were donated to institutions in the Columbus area.
- h. Books were donated to local libraries, book mobiles, schools, etc.
- i. Books were also made available to the members.

What will be kept on hand at Mission Resources?

The ONLY books that can be ordered through Mission Resources as of January 2019:

- a. Program Book
- b. Prayer Calendar
- c. Response
- d. Mission u study books, material
- e. SMR pins, yes SMR pins (more info to come regarding this)

Annual Sampler:

The Annual Sampler is still available.

Secretary, Program Resources (SPR) Position:

The SPR office has not been eliminated. The work will be different but not eliminated.

I know this is a lot of information to absorb, but I hope it helps in addressing the concerns that many, if not all of us are having. National continues to meet regarding this subject and I have been assured that I will be given additional information as it becomes available.


