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Team Sports Pass



LIMITED - \$200

Photograph one team for one game. Includes release of 10 digital files per player accessible via coupon code and photos are uploaded to one team gallery. Photos are not separated based on player. Average cost is \$20 for 10 players who purchase the pass.

UNLIMITED - \$300

Photograph one team for one game. Includes release of *all* digital files uploaded to a team gallery. Photos are not separated based on player. Average cost is \$30 for 10 players who purchase the pass.

Junior hurdler aims for supremacy in 3A

Like any race, Reid Clyburn approaches the starting line with his blocks, sets them up with his right foot leading.

He slides both feet into the blocks, adjusts and then bolts from the starting position for several feet. After he's satisfied, he walks away, waiting for the starter's instructions.

Standing behind line, Clyburn looks to the left. He looks to the right. He's the shortest high-hurdler, standing at 5 feet, 6 inches.

"To your blocks," instructs the starter. Clyburn walks around his blocks, puts his left foot back and then his right slides into the front slot. He positions his hands on the starting line, crouches quietly. He focuses on running his best and not jumping the gun – or false starting. The nerves begin to go away.

"Set."
Clyburn raises his head, staring down the lane as he focuses on the first hurdle, standing still at 36 inches, a little more than half his height. He's not just thinking about getting over the first hurdle. His mind is already set on clearing the eighth and final hurdle.

And then the gun goes off.
After the 15th step, Clyburn leaps with his left leg, reaches over with his right arm as if he were opening the door to the next hurdle. He plants his left foot with his right leg snapping over. Thirteen steps later, Clyburn strides over the second hurdle. And then the third hurdle. And eventually the eighth hurdle before cross-



ing the finish line, 300 meters and 41 seconds later.

"I try to run the hurdles not like I am jumping over each hurdle but running through them," Clyburn said. "I want my transition from running to launching and landing to feel completely smooth that helps keep my rhythm."
But he wasn't always hurdling.

He wanted to compete in sprints and relay events. His electric speed, which could be seen on the football field in the fall, made it an easy and obvious reason to race in the sprinting events during middle school. He joined the high school team during his freshman year and coaches typically ask their underclassmen to try out many of the events. Clyburn jumped in the pits. He ran the sprints and relays but hurdles were never in the picture.

Enter Steve Heck.
The recently retired coach asked the freshman to try out hurdles. And he didn't disappoint.

"I found that I had a natural ability to do pretty well at them and coach Heck saw enough of that ability to keep training me to run competitively in those events," Clyburn recalled. "I found out early after trying them that this was an event that I really liked and have grown to love after a few seasons."

Two springs later, Clyburn is now the best 300-meter hurdler in the 3A North after coming in fifth in last year's state meet, clocking in at a personal best 41.15, less than 2 seconds separated him from winning the state title.

"I want to be the No. 1 hurdler in the Northern Nevada 3A in both the 110-meter high hurdles and the 300-meter intermediate hurdles," Clyburn added.

Simply put, Clyburn wants to be the best and the time has come this spring.


The feature includes 2 photos and an article. Player completes a questionnaire and a story is written based off the information provided. The composite is unique and personally designed to accommodate two to three photos. The photo collage, which comes as a digital file at 300 dpi, is designed to be printed as an 8x10 or 16x20. A proof will be emailed to the client before delivery of the final product. Photos must be provided or a game pass or photos purchased separately.

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Tournament Photography

How tournament photography works:

- We set up a table/tent during the tournament where we have our work on display and answer questions and take down orders. We no longer offer on-site printing. Sports passes (pricing included on Page 1) are available for purchase before the tournament and these guarantee photos for that player. These include the print release.

How to request photos of specific players or teams:

- The presale is done online or calling us with payment prior the tournament. We do not accept unpaid requests to shoot photos during the tournament. This is due to many parents not following through, thus, wasting time that could have been devoted to someone who paid. Photos will be uploaded and available for download within two weeks of the tournament.

Does it cost the league?

- There is no cost to the league. We only ask that the league can help promote us as a vendor, if possible. We will create a digital flyer posted on our Facebook page and website, which is distributed to league. We do, however, love to give back to the community. With tournaments, we'll give the host a credit to a certain amount of photos. We will require the league to sign a contract, simply a mutual understanding of services being provided.

Team Photography

There is no cost to the league to hire. Order forms will be provided no later than one week before picture day. Like with tournament photography, we will contribute a donation but in the form of a silent auction item. This is normally a gift certificate for a free family or sports session. We will require the league to sign a contract, again, a mutual understanding of services being provided. Photos are edited for lighting but nothing more. Photos are provided in 72 dpi resolution at no less than 5,000 pixels across the longest edge. They are large enough to print poster size.
