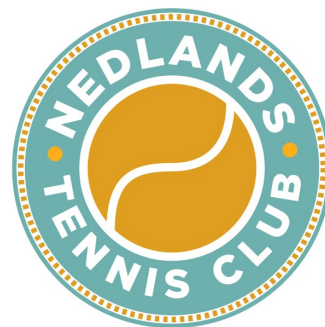

Under Organisation and Results click on Tennis West. Under Leagues and Divisions click on 2018 2019 then select a league you are interested in. For example Men’s Monday Night Fast Four. Look at any division and by checking the results of the matches played by the top and bottom teams on the ladder you can get an idea of the standard of players in that division of that competition.

In order to be in good form for the Summer League Season having individual or group lessons or hitting sessions with Club Coach Warren Vickers or one of his competent staff is highly recommended.

### TEAM TENNIS

In term two we trialled our new introduction to match-play program called Team Tennis. This program provides an extension to both our group coaching and our Friday Fun Club tennis options. ## July to September Court Availability

With the imminent closure of the grass courts due to their Winter rejuvenation, there may be certain times from now till the end of September where there is limited court availability for your own personal play. To add to the 5 hard courts and 2 synthetic courts, 3 grass courts (12, 13 and 14) will remain open over this period. The 2 new hard courts on 17 and 18 will be in use once fencing has been installed and lines added.

We welcome all members to use the courts at any time during the week and weekend and with 10 – 12 courts we hope there will always be a court available for your private use. However there are certain times where priority is given to league play, coaching and designated Club Social Play. A reminder of these times:

**Wednesday Men 7pm – 10pm**

**Thursday Ladies 7pm – 10pm** *ends Thursday 8 August*

**Saturday Ladies 12.30pm – 5pm** *ends Saturday 3 August*

**Sunday Juniors 9am – 12** *ends 18 August 2019*

**Wednesday Ladies 9am – 11am**

**Thursday Ladies 9am – 11am**

**Thursday Men 3pm – 5pm**

**Friday Fun Club Juniors 4.30pm – 6.30pm**

In addition to coaching this means peak court usage occurs on Wednesday mornings and nights, Thursday nights, Friday and Saturday afternoons. Please note it may not be possible to have courts available for your private use at these particular times.

When courts are heavily utilized please communicate with the coaches or players on court and discuss when courts may be available. Please respect those already on court and be prepared to be flexible and courteous at all times.



## Court Redevelopment

As you have all no doubt noticed, the court redevelopment works are now well under way, and in fact we are getting close to completion.

The foundations and wiring for the lighting of courts 4, 5 & 9 are all in, and two of the poles are up. We are just now waiting for the remaining four light fittings to arrive, which should be here any day. The plan is for all the lights to be up within the next 2 weeks, and the courts ready to play on at night by the end of the month.



On courts 17 & 18, all the lights are up and ready to go. The asphalt has finally been laid, following weeks of weather delay. Some of you will have noticed the erosion of the slope between 16 & 17 during all the rain. This has occurred because the contractor hadn't been able to complete the planned slope stabilisation work before the rain had set in. The stabilisation work will take place over the next 2 weeks, which will tidy everything up and stop the soil being eroded. All that remains to be done is for the fences to go up, the nets to go in, and the plexipave surface to go on. Unfortunately, we will need to wait for warmer weather before the plexipave can be applied (probably October?), but in the meantime we will mark the courts up with white painted lines, and the they will be fine to play on.



The new play equipment is now all in, thanks to fantastic efforts of Janet Ferreira.

A big thank you also to Jack Richardson for all his help with the painting.

The last project that now needs to be done is the installation of the Book-a-Court system. The contract for this work will be signed this week, and should all be up and running by the end of August.

Thanks again to all the club members who have so generously donated to the court redevelopment works. None of this could have happened without your fantastic support.

So I took it on board to find a team of newbies who had no idea what they were up for.....

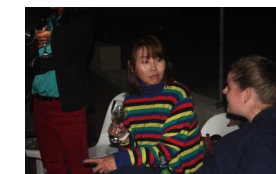

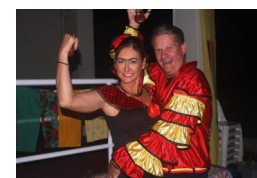
