A BRIEF HISTORY

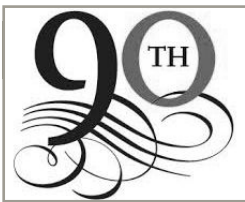


Social tennis was enjoyed on two gravel courts at the home of Mr G.R. Brown in The Avenue. When Mr Brown decided to sell his property, three keen players decided to investigate the possibility of forming a tennis club. A public meeting was held in June 1925 and the 67 people who attended ensured the formation of the Nedlands Park Tennis Club. The Club decided to accept the offer of land from the Claremont Road Board which sits on today's Esplanade close to where the Nedlands Yacht Club stands now, and club members set to work to clear the bulrushes. Four gravel courts were laid but they proved difficult to maintain, as the location was not conducive to playing tennis, being very windy thus making the courts susceptible to constant erosion. After a year, the Club Secretary was requested to make investigations into securing a more suitable site.

When Melvista Park became available for a major sporting complex in the 1930s, the Club negotiated with the Road Board into laying six grass courts on the corner of Bruce Street and Gallop Road. These courts (now Courts 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 8) were located on the south-eastern corner of the grounds. The early days at Bruce Street were difficult, and often members found themselves rolling and marking the courts at night with the aid of hurricane lamps. Unable to finance a proper clubhouse, members had to make do with a bush-bough shelter and an open fire for boiling the billy for afternoon tea. In early 1931, the Road Board floated a special loan to finance the construction of a clubhouse, which resulted in the construction of a timber-framed building with tiled roof, clad with a weatherboard dado and cement sheeting. By the mid 1930s, more courts were needed, and the Club successfully secured enough ground for another five courts (Courts 10, 12, 13, 14, and the grass court now divided into two hard courts 15 and 16). In 1934, the Club dropped the word "Park" from its name and became "The Nedlands Tennis Club Inc".

In the late 1930s, club member Harold Krantz, a prominent architect, designed a new clubhouse in functionalist style, which fitted well with the Inter-War art-deco styles predominant in Nedlands. Tenders for the clubhouse were advertised in *Building and Construction* in January 1938, and the contract was awarded to a local contractor for a price of \$1573.00

From these humble beginnings, Nedlands Tennis Club now boasts 19 grass courts, 5 hard courts and two synthetic courts with a membership of about 400 including a large junior base.

COACHING TIP OF THE MONTH: **Get your priorities right!**

Think about this....how many shots does the average rally go for? 10 shots? 7 shots? Maybe 4? Turns out it is just under that, roughly 3.8 shots. So look at what is important:

Shot 1 – **the serve**, is it reliable? Is it controlled? Can you start the point how you want it played out?

Shot 2 – **the return**, does it negate the serve? Can you take control of the point?

Shot 3 – dependent on shots 1 & 2.

So when you practice, are you working on your groundstroke rallies for hours? Maybe doing some volley work? How long do you spend on the two shots that matter the most? If you want to make the biggest difference in a match, you need to master the serve and the return; they make up more than 50% of most rallies and are the only two guarantees.

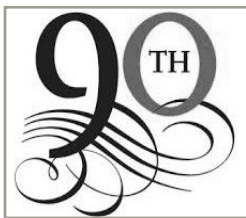
