

Dear members and friends

If we proceed sensibly with a development program for, say, more lighting and hard courts, the City is likely to be of greater assistance than it has previously, specifically because the 'pool' of State Government (DSR) Funding has diminished dramatically.

I look forward to participating in the upcoming Club Championships, in both Open and Round Robin Events, and I trust that as many of us that can, will do the same. They are held earlier this leap year, and Helen Morgan has had to really push the program to enable a workable representation in all events. At last count she has succeeded, and we thank you for that Helen.

So, all the best for the 2016 tennis year, and in particular the summer season; we will be 'praying for sunshine' before we know it! Thank you for your ongoing involvement and support of a very fine club and community asset.

STEWART FINCH


