ABOUT THE HYMNS

Kasper Uhlenberg, (Dec 24 1549 – Feb 16, 1617), was a German composer, a Catholic convert, a theological writer and a translator of the Bible. He wrote the hymn to the Sacred Heart in 1582

St. Alphonso Liguori, (Sept. 27, 1696- Aug. 1, 1787), re-wrote the hymn to the tune *Cor Amans* in 1787. It was translated by R. Coffin in 1885. This song is from a collection, "Sacred Heart Hymns", published in 1951 in Boston.

Peter Griesbacher, (March 25, 1864 – Jan 28, 1933) was a German classical composer organist and bell expert. He studied in Passau and was ordained a priest in 1886. From 1895. Griesbacher composed predominantly Catholic church music and played a role in the transition of Catholic church music from the 19th to the 20th century. He created about 250 works, including 49 masses.

Frank N. Birtchnell , (May 28th, 1860 - Apr 10th 1941),.was an English Composer for the Organ and Headmaster. He helped compiled and arranged hymns for the Sisters of Norte Dame. *O Take Me to Thy Sacred Heart* is one of those hymns.

J. N.Williams, (1873– unknown), was an American composer writing in the 1800s along with Birtchnell he helped and composed hymns for the Sisters of Norte Dame.

St Margaret Mary Alacoque, (July 22, 1647- Oct 17, 1690) was a French Roman Catholic nun and mystic. who promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. She composed the Litany text after Jesus permitted her to rest her head upon his heart, and then disclosed to her the wonders of his love, telling her that he desired to make them known to all mankind and to diffuse the treasures of his goodness, and that he had chosen her for this work.

Lorenzo Perosi, (Dec 21, 1872 –Oct 12, 1956), was an Italian composer of sacred music, *O Cor Jesu* is from his *Messa da Requiem* (1897). He was inspired by Pope Pius X to infuse priestly sanctity into music. He offered Mass daily and spent many hours in prayer.

Fr Tom Luby, M.S.C., (Deceased), Fr Tom Luby, MSC. An Australian Missionary composed *Ametur* a 16th-century-style motet in three parts. The motto of the M.S. Cs is "May the Sacred Heart of Jesus be everywhere loved, forever!"

Sr Marie Josephine SND (Flore Magnan), (Nov 23, 1890-Dec 14, 1913), was an American composer and novitiate at Joliette in Seattle, (Sisters of Mary Immaculate Queen), composed the text. Kevin Mayhew Ltd, compiled the hymn along with hymns in English, Irish, Latin and mixed languages in "Hymns Old and New" first published in 1977 and published by the Dublin-based Kevin Mayhew (Ireland) Ltd for the Roman Catholic Church in Ireland. The tune is set to *Fons Amoris* - a traditional melody.

St Louis de Montfort, (Jan 31, 1673 – April 28, 1716), Written by St. Louis de Montfort and dedicated to St MM Alacoque. Gilbert Chevalier transcribed this piece .

St Louis de Montfort, (Jan 31, 1673 – April 28, 1716), Was French composer. The saint is best known for his spiritual writings, and poetry. During his missions he managed to compose around 600 hymns consisting of more than 20,000 verses. Gilbert Chevalier (Aveugle) is a living blind composer, poet and performer who transcribes and categorizes the works of St. Louis de Montfort.
