Seven Sayings of Jesus on the Cross Spanish: Las Siete Palabras

1. Luke 23:34: Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do All repeat with reader, then prayer is read

Spanish prayer response:

Spanish Translation of First Word read by reader:

- a. Song: As Jesus Came to Mourn
- b. Come and Mourn with Me
- Luke: 23-43: And he said to him, "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise" All repeat with reader, then prayer is read
 - a. You are Merciful, O Lord
 - b. Jesu Dulcis Memoria
- John 19:26-27: Woman, behold your son, Son, behold your mother All repeat with reader, then prayer is read
 - a. At the Cross Her Station Keeping
 - b. Dolorosa
- Matthew 27: 46 & Mark 15:34 My God, My God, why have you forsaken me? All repeat with reader, then prayer is read
 - a. Amemonos de Corazon
 - b. Jesus Remember Me(follow with music on next page)Taize sung prayer: Meditative



- 5. John 19:28: I thirst. All repeat with reader, then prayer is read
- 6. John 19:30: It is finished. All repeat with reader, then prayer is read (From the Greek "Tetelestai" which is also translated "it is accomplished", or "it is complete".)


