The Department of Environmental Services (DES) has informed us that their treatment of the milfoil invasion at Chance Pond this summer was successful. Many thanks to Randall Werner, a lake resident, and Trisha Wildes, of Chance Pond Road, who were instrumental in spotting the milfoil and getting samples to DES. DES then inspected, mapped, and treated the area where the milfoil was located. Let's all become educated and remain vigilant in looking out for the health of our lake. That's what the Weed Watcher Program is all about. Watch the Spring newsletter for a date in late May or early June for the next Weed Watcher seminar to be held here at the Steadman Pavilion.
