

### #Where's your head at?

**“Know your part, play your part, trust your part and then  
let the HEAD lead”**

In the final part of our series on UNITY – we will be looking at TRUST.

The body is made up of many parts and each part has a function no matter how big or small – each part has a vital role to play. The stapedius is the smallest muscle in the human body which helps to protect your inner ear from loud noises. The largest organ of the body is the skin – whilst you can see the skin and understand its function, you can't see the stapedius but still have a vital part to play. So is it the same for the body of Christ – all have vital part to play.

The body cannot function without a head – Christ the head of the church and we can only learn to be an effective and healthy body – A healthy body is realising that we cannot trust others if we cannot trust Christ first.
