The flowers this morning are given to the glory of God and in celebration of Pentecost. They were created by Jean Baskin in celebration of gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. In Jean's words, “The key to all to be blessed with these gifts and receive the Holy Spirit is love. “ "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another." John 13:34

Today we celebrate Pentecost, the birthday of the church. The English word “Pentecost” is a transliteration of the Greek word pentekostos, which means fifty. Pentecost is 50 days after Easter. This day is significant in the time of the early church. It marked the time the Holy Spirit was poured out on Jesus’ first followers empowering them for their mission. We believe the same Spirit still empowers us for mission today, and gathers us in worship, study, and fellowship as the Body of Christ.

Today we share in the Sacrament of the Lord’s Supper. The table is open to all who trust in Jesus Christ. All are welcome to share in the communion meal. If you are not able to come forward, the elders will come and serve you in your pew.

Special Pentecost Offering today. In addition to our regular morning offerings, we celebrate the birthday of the church and gift of the Holy Spirit with the Pentecost Offering. The Holy Spirit remains with us, connecting us with the church of the past, continuing to inspire the church of today, and pointing us to the church of the future. 40% of this Special Offering will go to Blowing Rock’s Food 4 Families program and the remaining monies will go to youth ministries in church-wide efforts of nurturing the faith of our youth near and far.

You can pick them up at the conclusion of the service. Our students in 2nd grade and older will remain in the sanctuary. There are updated worship clipboards at the entrance of the sanctuary for any child to use during worship.
