

Throughout the year the committee reviewed and discussed monthly activities, cash flows, changes in bank balances, and actual expenses verses the budgeted amount. In August 2015 the 2014 Annual Audit of the Rumple Financial Statements was issued by our CPA, Virginia Stanton of Boone. No exceptions were noted in the audit.
