
Debora Smith joins the Central Services Leadership Team

The Results are in...

Your nominating Committee has counted and recounted the results of Sunday's congregational vote for elders. Here are the results: Seven names were placed before the congregation for voting: four nominees being offered by the Nominating Committee and three nominees being offered by the congregation. There being only four session vacancies to be filled, the matter was put before the congregation for voting by secret paper ballot, four names to be written on each ballot, two men and two women as required by the Rumple Manual of Operations. The ballots were collected by appointed tellers, counted and tabulated under the direction of the co-chairs of the Nominating Committee, and the results reported back to the congregation as follows:

Eighty-three valid ballots were cast by active members of the congregation. Four elders were elected by a majority of votes cast as required by the Book of Order. Elected Elders, their vote totals and percentages are as follows:

Kim Rogers received 72 votes, 87% of votes cast.
Cullie Tarleton received 64 votes or 77% of votes cast.
Misty Mayfield received 57 votes or 69% of votes cast.
Davis Hankins received 50 votes or 60% of votes cast.
The next highest nominee received 30 votes or 36% of votes cast.

The congregation has chosen four new elders to serve all of us. Now it is up to all of us to move forward as a church. Our old friend and fellow Presbyterian, Fred Rogers (known by a generation of children as "Mr. Rogers"), gave us great advice: "It's very dramatic when two people come together to work something out. . . . What is really exciting to me is to see people with differing views come together and finally respect each other."

Ordinary people like you and me are called by Jesus to live above the fray. That's tough! Fred Rogers knew how hard those words are to live out. It's only possible when we surrender ourselves to the will of the Holy Spirit that called us to this church in the first place.

Joan Gray and Joyce Tucker, in their book *Presbyterian Polity for Church Leaders*, write: **"We** are not Presbyterians because we all believe the same things; we are Presbyterians because we believe God calls us to be in this particular place as Presbyterians."

Let us remember Paul's advice to the church at Corinth: "So with yourselves; since you are eager for spiritual gifts, strive to excel in them for building up the church." I Corinthians 14:12.

In God's grace and mercy, may we live into that call. Maggie
