Today we celebrate Pentecost, the birthday of the church. The English word “Pentecost” is a transliteration of the Greek word *pentekostos*, which means fifty. Pentecost is 50 days after Easter. The event that we remember and celebrate in the church is recorded in Scripture in the Acts of the Apostles, chapter 2. This day became significant for the early church as it marked the time the Holy Spirit was poured out on Jesus’ first followers empowering them for their mission. We believe the same Spirit still empowers us for mission today.

Today we will celebrate the Sacrament of the Lord’s Supper. The table is open to all who trust in Jesus Christ. All are welcome to share in the communion meal.
