Dear Rumple Church Family,

As I write this, the rain continues to pour down in Texas and the reports of continued catastrophic flooding fill the news updates that come into my cell phone. I know you join me in offering ardent prayers for all those who are in harms way as this natural disaster unfolds. We pray for those who have lost people they love in the flooding and wind, we pray for those who will lose all their material possessions, we pray for those whose lives have been and will be uprooted and uncertain for weeks and even months to come. We also pray for all the rescue workers, government leaders, and those in serving professions who are working hard, day and night to bring people to safety and to keep them fed and housed.

Our own Presbyterian Disaster Assistance is already on the ground in Houston, working with other agencies, to assess the damage and to begin to plan for long term rebuilding and repair. All agencies and relief organizations are stressing that the very best way we can help right now (in addition to our prayers) is through monetary gifts. Information on how you can give online, by mail, or over the phone, to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, is provided here in the *Slate and Stone* and will be on Rumple's website as well.

At the wonderful picnic after church this past Sunday, I heard a Rumple member share her memories from 18 years ago when a team of Rumple members headed to eastern NC, after Hurricane Floyd, on a mission trip to help with flood relief there. The needs after Hurricane Harvey are not even known yet, but I know that the Rumple family will be prepared not only with prayers and monetary gifts, but to help in other ways as we respond to God's call.

I look forward to my first fall here in Blowing Rock. These cool mornings and the first few colorful leaves are already telling us that fall is just around the corner. I hope to see you in worship, at a fellowship meal, working on the Faith Build Habitat House, at a youth group event, or in continued gatherings I plan to host at the manse throughout the fall.

Our prayers go up for our brothers and sisters in Texas and we pray the Rumple family will continue to be open to how and where God is leading us.

2017 Nominating Committee Seeks Your Nominees

The 2017 Nominating Committee has begun their work. This year's committee, per the Rumble Manual of Procedures, is made up of three at large members (elected in October 2016) and two elders in the class of 2017. Committee members are: Kathy Earley (chair), Audrey Gurkin, Mike Mayfield, Curt Salthouse (secretary), Bill Thorn.

The committee is tasked with nominating four elders for the class of 2020 (elders in the Presbyterian Church are elected for a three year term,) and nominating three at-large members for the 2018 Nominating Committee (who will be joined by two elders from the class of 2018.)

The Nominating Committee solicits names from you, the members and friends of Rumble. Please suggest folks who you think will make good spiritual leaders for Rumble. Nominations can be made by filling out a form or by emailing the committee chair, Kathy Earley, at kathyearley50@gmail.com by September 3. In September, the Committee will begin their prayerful deliberations of selecting four nominees (two men and two women per Rumble's Manual of Procedures) willing to serve. They will also select three at large members as nominees for next year's nominating committee.

The Nominating Committee has asked the Session to call a congregational meeting for Sunday October 15. As is allowed in Presbyterian polity, other candidates may be nominated from the floor, if the person nominating has secured the permission of the candidate. All active members (but not affiliate members) of Rumble are eligible to serve as elders and are able to vote in the congregational meeting. Details about the time of the meeting and the Nominating Committee's slate of nominees will be announced later in September.

The purpose of this meeting will be to hear the recommendations of the Nominating Committee of four nominees for elder class of 2020 and three at-large 1018 Nominating Committee members.

OF CHILDREN®**
a program by **DARKNESS TO LIGHT**

Did you know that Rumple Church has a policy for protecting children and youth? It is called **C.A.S.E.: Creating a Safe Environment for Children, Youth and Adults**. This is an important document with safeguards to protect children, youth and adults when they interact with each other at Rumple events. It is a sad and true fact that about 1 in 10 children in the U.S. will be sexually abused before their 18th birthday.
We must stop it before it starts.

The *Stewards of Children* class teaches participants how to make a difference and help end child sexual abuse.

Our C.A.S.E. policy requires ALL adult volunteers who work with children and youth attend a *Stewards of Children* class and get background screened. Even if you do not work directly with the children at Rumple, this is still a very good and useful information to know.

You may have had the class in the past, but it is now updated and so the Christian Education Committee is asking everyone to be trained with the new information. Cameron Womack, Authorized Facilitator, will offer the class three times in September. You are asked to pick the one that suits your schedule and register.
Total cost is \$16 and includes background screening.
