Dear Rumple Family,

Fresh on the heels of a wonderful celebration of the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the start of the Protestant Reformation, with beautiful music (thank you Dave McCollum, Eric Luke, and our talented choir), light hearted drama, theological reflection and study, we are somehow headed into the month of November.

October was a busy month at Rumple and I wanted to share with you about some important events and decisions. First, the Session received the resignation of our Director of Christian Education, Cameron Womack. (There is more about this on a subsequent page of this Slate and Stone.) The Personnel Committee and Session are meeting to discuss interim staffing to cover Cameron's areas of responsibility and we are calling on each and every one of you to lend a hand as well. Please speak to me or to any elder about ways that you can help in this time of transition.

At their retreat on October 14, the Session agreed to appoint a "dream team" to explore the vision and mission of Rumple as we head into 2018 and beyond. The hope is to include many of you in the kinds of conversations the Session has been having this year- what makes Rumple special? Who is God calling Rumple to be and what is God calling us to do? How we will accomplish that? In light of Cameron's resignation, the future staffing needs of Rumple will surely be a part of these discussions as well. Expect to hear more about this in the new year.

Also at their retreat on October 14, the Session agreed that Rumple would assume "administrative oversight" of Blowing Rock CARES. As you may know, this food pantry and emergency assistance ministry has been housed at Rumple for over four years. Much of their all-volunteer leadership is ready to retire or cut back on their time commitments to the ministry. Instead of closing down this valuable ministry, the board of Blowing Rock CARES approached Rumple about assuming administrative oversight. I convened a task force in September who then made a report to the Session. Blowing Rock CARES will remain a 501c3 with a separate board, separate bank accounts, separate bylaws. Rumple will now have oversight of the board, who will report to the Session, on a regular basis. Rumple will appoint board members, but not all will be members of Rumple, intentionally. Blowing Rock CARES will remain a mission of the entire community. A period of transition has begun and Tim Harris, if elected by the board, will begin in 2018 as Board chair, taking over from Linda Laughter, who has led this ministry from its inception. I am thrilled that Rumple could step in to help with this transition so that this valuable ministry can continue in our community. If you can help with Blowing Rock CARES or if you have questions, please direct them to Tim Harris or to me.

I remain grateful for the many ways that God is leading us at Rumple.
