We thank Rumple member and artist, Wes Waugh, for the art on the cover of our Easter 2018 bulletin. Wes says about this painting, "As an artist, and specifically a landscape artist, my creative senses often feel very reflective of not only the colors, but the moods of a season. The heart of winter, the beginning of the Lenten season, feels very somber and reflective. The rebirth of landscape color is right on our doorstep as Easter approaches, and practically impossible for an artist, especially a colorist, not to respond to. I often reflect on this passage from the far East, attributed to the Bauls,' Don't try to force anything. Let life be a deep let-go. See God opening millions of flowers every day without forcing the buds, waiting, never in a hurry, giving their time to them. Everything happens at its right time, everything happens in its own season. Wait, don't be impatient, don't be in a hurry. All hurry is greed, and all hurry is a subtle fight. That which is going to happen will happen. Whenever it is going to happen it will happen; you need not fight existence. You can surrender, you can trust.' After a dark and gloomy episode, we now move to celebrate the Arisen Christ, the rebirth of spring and color."
