

RUMPLE: CALLED TO WORSHIP AND EMPOWERED TO SERVE

Everyone is invited to remain after 11:00 worship this morning to enjoy *Lemonade on the Lawn* sponsored by Circle 3 today.

Back2School collection is underway to provide school supplies to students in Watauga County to start school off right! We need: 750 composition notebooks, 200 packs of colored pencils, 50 backpacks for all ages by August 1. There is a collection box in the church reception area. We have 475 notebooks, 74 packs of pencils and 74 backpacks so far.

Trauma Education Classes begin August 5. Traumatic events including natural disasters, child abuse, illness, death of a love one, school shootings and many others, can have lasting impacts on individuals and communities. Each Sunday morning in August, in the Fellowship Hall 9:45-10:45, we'll host a series of forums dealing with trauma and discuss how we can respond as a church.

New members will meet with the Session at 10:30 and then be introduced during 11:00 worship. Children's Church is a worship education class for children kindergarten- second grade. There is a Sunday School class for our children, kindergarten through 5th grade. They meet in the “Butterfly classroom” from 9:45—10:45, led by Holly Bannan. Join us as we explore the parable of “The Good Samaritan”.
