He is an Old Testament professor, as well as the director of the Doctor of Ministry degree, at Emory University in Atlanta, GA. He will be teaching and speaking based on his recent book, *The Old Testament is Dying: A diagnosis and Recommended Treatment*.

Rumble's annual Grandfather Home Sunday is next Sunday, August 19 at 11:00. This year marks the 100th anniversary of Grandfather Home Sundays at Rumble. It was August 1918 when Rumble first celebrated our historic relationship with the home, now part of Children's Hope Alliance, and received an offering of \$1000 for the home. Trauma and Resiliency Forums continue this morning through August 26 in the Fellowship Hall, 9:45-10:45. August 26 we'll discuss how we, at Rumble, can respond to all we've learned. We'll conclude the series with a Healing and Wholeness service on August 29 at 6 in the sanctuary.
