Second Annual Rise Against Hunger meal packing event is today. Rumble will join to pack at least 19,000 meals (twice as many as last year) for hungry school children around the world. This year's event is at the Blowing Rock School gym from 3:00-5:00 p.m. Sign up before or after worship in the office reception area to volunteer.

The next Second Sunday Lunch is Sunday, April 14, after worship. The Fellowship Committee will be making some delicious Shepherd's Pie (even a vegetarian option) served with salad and dessert.

Blowing Rock CARES Food pantry needed items for April: toilet paper, cooking oil, ketchup, mustard, salad dressing, jello gelatin mix, jello pudding mix; always welcome: canned fruit (especially pineapple) in light syrup, canned vegetables, canned beans, canned soup. You may bring items anytime during the month of April and leave them in the shopping cart in the office reception area.

Easter Sunday will be a busy day at Rumble! The Worship Committee plans to have friendly faces in the church parking lots from 8-12 to welcome visitors and help with any parking issues. And, if you attend the breakfast, 9:00 worship, and stay for Sunday school or the children's activities, try to vacate your parking space by 10:45 (or sooner) to allow space for folks attending 11:00 worship. And, if you are able, consider parking in the deck at BRAHM or by the American Legion building to free up more spaces at Rumble for Easter visitors and guests. The 9:00 service will be identical to the 11:00 service, with the same special music. If you can attend the early service to make space for visitors at 11:00, please do!
