The Children's Council's mission is to build a strong foundation for children's learning and development by strengthening families, the early childhood system, and the wider community. They focus their mission on children 0-5 years old based in the knowledge that these first years are most critical in a child's development.

IN ADDITION TO OUR MONETARY OFFERING TONIGHT, as we celebrate the birth of the baby Jesus, we will be receiving diapers to donate for the Children's Council of Watauga County. Believing that "all children deserve equal care and basic necessities," the Council supplies free diapers to local families in need through their "Who Needs a Change?" program.
