Lent and Ash Wednesday

Lent is the season in the church year in which we, as the community of Christians, prepare, through prayer and penance, for the renewing of our baptismal promises at the celebration of Jesus' resurrection on Easter. In the Old Testament we read that the Israelites used ashes and dust as signs of mortality, sorrow, and repentance. By A.D. 1091, Christians had universally accepted the practice of using ashes on the head as a sign of the desire for healing from brokenness and sin. This season and this service helps to prepare us for resurrection!

Our Lenten journey to Easter and beyond begins with Ash Wednesday's tracing of a cross with ashes on our foreheads or our hand. In this symbolic action we face our mortality, recognize our need for God the Author and Sustainer of all things, and look forward to personal and communal renewal at Easter.

Our Lenten Cross was created for Lent and Easter this year by Jim Crowell and Becca Vickrey. It will remain in the sanctuary throughout Lent and Easter Sunday.

Lent Small Group Bible Study. Kathy will lead a small group Bible study on Wednesday mornings from 9:15-10:30 beginning March 4 and continuing through April 8. The group will explore the Gospel of Matthew, particularly the texts from the Sermon on the Mount that Kathy will be preaching on each Sunday during Lent. All levels of Bible knowledge and B

ible study experience are welcome.

Special Adult Sunday School Class for Lent Beginning March 1st, Dave McCollum and Stephanie Hankins will teach a five week Sunday school class entitled "Won't You Be My Neighbor?". This class will look at the important lessons taught by our favorite Presbyterian minister, Mr. Rogers. This class will run through March 29 and meet 9:30-10:30 in the Adult Classroom Upstairs.

Blowing Rock C.A.R.E.S. Special Lent Food Collection We will continue our support of the BR CARES Food Pantry during the Lenten season. Blowing Rock CARES will be collecting special donations for an Easter dinner for their clients. In addition to the regular pantry items, they will be providing items for a special Easter dinner. Please consider supporting BR CARES with a monetary donation or with non-perishable items such as canned yams, trail mix and brown sugar along with personal items (toilet paper, toothpaste, soap). They will also be collecting bags of potatoes and onions. Please bring items anytime during the Lenten season (through April 5) and leave them in the shopping cart in the church office reception area. Checks should be clearly marked with "BR CARES Easter food collection" in the memo line and can be made to Rumble or directly to BR CARES.

Our annual Rise Against Hunger meal packing event will be Sunday April 5 at Blowing Rock School, 3-5 pm. Rumble will join with St. Mary's Episcopal Church, St. Mark Lutheran Church, and Presbyterian-Episcopal Campus Ministry to pack over 18,000 meals for hungry children around the world. Volunteers are encouraged to sign up online ahead of the event to allow for a quicker start the afternoon of the event. Consider this mission effort as part of your Lenten journey.
