2019 Highlights

- * Conducted the most successful Stewardship Campaign in over 12 years increasing the total amount committed in 2020 to just over \$395,000 from 92 pledging units.
- * Installed a screen and projector in the sanctuary.
- * Hosted the cast and directors of "From the Mountaintop" the original musical about the life of Rev. Edgar Tufts, one of Rumple's first pastors, and organized a group of members and friends to go see the performance in Banner Elk.
- * Hosted a week of Music and Mission Camp for elementary age children.

These events were advertised in the local newspaper, through the Chamber of Commerce, and by a sign in the front yard of the Church. A "Blue Christmas" Service was scheduled in December as a coordinated effort with St. Mary's and FaithBridge.
- 2. Continued support of a progressive system of Christmas decorating in the Sanctuary as a visible example of the "Waiting" during the Advent Season.
- 3. Continued systematic updating of the Rumple Wedding Policy, with ideas and support from the Wedding Coordinators Team.
- 4. Supported training individuals to serve as a team of Sound System Operators for Sunday Worship, for weddings, for funerals and memorial services, and for various other services.
- 5. Planned for Holy Week and Easter Services Maundy Thursday Service, Good Friday Combined Service with First Pres in Boone; Easter Sunrise Service in the Town Park Rotary Pavillon for the Community; two Worship Services (9:00 and 11:00). These Easter activities were advertised in the local newspaper, through the Chamber of Commerce and with a sign in the front yard of the Church.
- 6. Planned for two Sunday Services beginning on Memorial Weekend and ending on Labor Day.
- 7. Planned with Lees McRae's Theater Program to support the visit of cast of Edgar Tufts play written by Janet Spear, to a Worship Service in June. Church members also attended the Play as a group outing in July.
- 8. Established new Usher/Greeter Guidelines in support of Rumple's Safety/Security Guidelines.
- 9. Supported the purchase of a new piano for the Choir Room.
- 10. Supported the planning and workshop for a Composer Weekend for the choir and the Sunday Worship Service.
- 11. Supported the efforts for better communication within our church family.

The RMPC Youth Group had a fantastic year in 2019 filled with mission and fellowship. Many of our high school youth participated in the Triennial International Mission Trip which was hosted in Añasco, Puerto Rico. Daily devotions and community worship were coupled with the repair and re-organization of several homes under the care of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. Our middle school group participated in a mission trip to Charlotte, and together the RMPC Youth were called to Asheville, NC to work with the Black Mountain Home for Children as well as the preparation for the grand re-opening of12 Baskets Café through Asheville Youth Missions. The annual trip to Montreat Youth Conference connected us to youth across NC and Christ through the theme "Let Love Lead". Our group was led to several at-home projects as well, from working with Blowing Rock Cares to Rise Against Hunger and bringing the light of Christ to Deerfield Assisted Living through hymns and sermons. We hope to accomplish all of these things and more throughout 2020 with Psalm Studies and mission trips to Wilmington and Charlotte.

2019 Blowing Rock CARES Annual Report

Client Services (Food) – The Active Client database was 58 households [56 households (97%) were clients for all of 2019]. We served an average 24 households per week (44 adults and 12 children in them). A total of 39 households (67 adults and 21 children) made at least one visit during the year. We provided food boxes every other week, over 10 weeks, for 11 Blowing Rock School families that participated in the Food4Families project during Summer 2019. We provided Thanksgiving and Christmas dinner items for active client households and 18 Blowing Rock School families.

Client Services (Other) – We assisted active client households with issues affecting access to food or safe/effective use of food and contributed to WeCan, referring individuals and families there, as needed, for help with utility bills.

Food Donations - Blowing Rock CARES 2019 food donations by weight totaled 4,331 pounds (a little more than 2 tons (compared with a little more than 1 ton in 2018). This amount would provide food for 4 visits by the 39 households that had at least one visit during the year. Regular donations in December totaled 1,207 pounds. Separate from that, Reverse advent donations from Rumple were 451 pounds, and from St. Mary of the Hills were 290 pounds. Donations came mostly from members of Rumple and St. Mary of the Hills. Other sources included the Blowing Rock Community Harvest Dinner; Blowing Rock School; Blowing Rock Community Library; Gospel, Grits & Gravy (donated by Blowing Rock Chamber of Commerce and the Mast Store); J. McLaughlin; Monkees; and one individual. **Volunteers** – Volunteer service for the year totaled 913 hours. Volunteers (regular corps of 30-35) help with all aspects of restocking our food supply, serve as pantry organizers, check in clients, help clients get food to their cars, and deliver food to some of our clients. In addition, they often learn things from our clients that help us more effectively serve them. We also had box packing help at various times from Rumple youth and volunteers from St. Mary of the Hills. We would not be able to do what we do without our volunteers.

Makotos Charity Golf Tournament – This tournament in 2019 raised just over \$8,000 for Blowing Rock Cares (compared with just over \$10,000 in 2018).

Finances – Income (all sources) was just under \$36,000 and expenses (food and nonfood) were just under \$39,000. Total food expenses were just above \$32,500 for the year. **Board of Directors** – Three new members joined the Board in 2019. Kelly (Baruth) Scott, a community member (our thank you letter writer), Dennis Norris, a community member (our food coordinator), and Dale Hamrick, a Rumple member who is at the pantry almost every week. They have been great additions to the Board. Two members rotated off the Board after two years' service – Stephanie Hankins, our Secretary, and Ray Pickett, our Vice President. We value their service and wish them well in their new ventures.
