Welcome . . .

My Name is Gary Hessen. I was born in Detroit Lakes, Minnesota on July 17, 1960.

My mother Patricia was a fervent Catholic woman, from which the first foundation of our religious life flowed for both my sister Mary and I. We grew in our faith, teachings, and prayer life with the support from the sisters of Holy Rosary Catholic Church and School. My father, Willard Hessen was an outdoorsman and from him I learned at an early age to see God in His many wonders of creation. From a duck blind as the sun rose over the mist on the lake, to fishing in our boat and catching Northerns and Walleyes until sunset. From both my parents, I was able to develop the foundation for my spiritual and religious education; especially integrating scriptures into my daily life.

We left Minnesota for the warmth and beaches of Florida in August of 1969. It was quite a transition turning in my snow boots for flip-flops and my snow board for a surf board. Our family settled in Satellite Beach, Florida and I quickly became involved in altar serving, migrant ministry, and parish life at Holy Name of Jesus Catholic Church. I joined the Boy Scouts and enjoyed many summers camping, fishing, and traveling across the United States with my family and scout troop. I even earned my Eagle Scout Award and have treasured the principals of the Scout Oath and Promise throughout my life.

Upon graduating from Satellite High School, I attended Brevard Community College and UCF majoring in Elementary Education. Teaching ran in the family as both my parents were teachers; but thanks to the encouragement, and examples of great priests in my life: Fr. Fred Ruse, Peter Henry, and Paul Rankin and a certain calling to serve God, I attended St. Meinrad Seminary, IN and Mundelein Seminary, IL in discernment for the priesthood and received my Masters Degree in Theology from St. Leo's University. I have always had a strong faith and deep love in my heart for the poor and those suffering from social injustices. Mother Theresa and John Paul II are my models for service, along with our current Pope Francis and His "Joy of the Gospel."

It was during those formation years 1984 – 1989 that I helped form our relationship with our Sister Diocese in San Juan de la Maguana in the Dominican Republic. As one story goes, I met a beautiful girl named Charo and fell in love with her; we have been joyfully married now for 27 years. God has blessed us with so many good times and two beautiful children Patricia (26) and Timothy (23).

The calling to the Diaconate comes from wonderful encouragement, prayer, and support of so many people in my life. I am so grateful for our sister parish family at St. Joseph Catholic Parish in Palm Bay, FL., My wife and children, my sister Mary Lynn (Palm Bay), our pastor Fr. Jeremiah Payne, Fr. Bill Hanley, and especially my (lately departed) spiritual director and friend Msgr. Cleo Schmenk. It is the humbleness and humility of service that I most appreciate in this calling to the Diaconate. The call to bring others to Christ, not only in the Words we speak, but our actions of love and mercy.

I thank each and every one of you, the people who have been instrumental in my discernment and formation; your love and prayers have been a blessing in my life. In turn, I also pray that God will bless you; and that I will have many opportunities to experience your faith and friendship as we build the Kingdom of God here at Our Lady of Lourdes. May God use each of us to bring Glory and Honor to His name as we walk our faith journey together.
