Bowing and Genuflection

I have to admit that I sometimes laugh to myself when I see people enter into church who genuflect to their pew or bow to the wall. Do we know what we are doing and why? The church gives us instruction that before and after Mass, all who enter into the church should genuflect towards the tabernacle, showing reverence and honor for the real presence of Christ. During Mass, when approaching the sanctuary, all should bow to the altar of sacrifice. Here, Jesus becomes known to us in the blessing of the bread and wine, his true body and blood. We should never bow or genuflect to a statue or a cross. We may pray near them, but they don't require our recognition of them with a bow or genuflection.

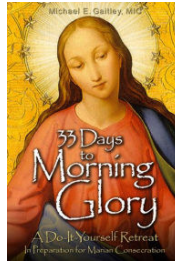

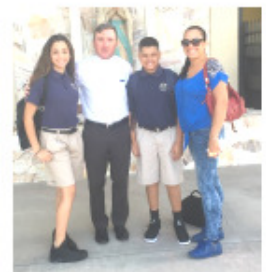

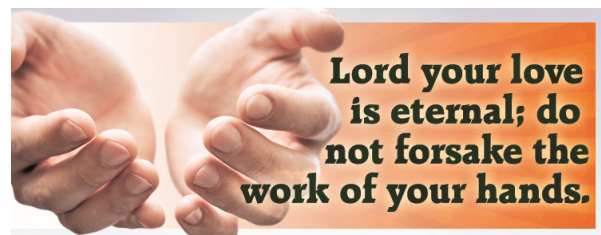
