## From the Pastor's Desk...

Hello, Wonderful People of Church in the Wildwood!

It's December already, and we're well into our Advent and Christmas events. The place looks great, doesn't it? Many thanks to the crew of 16 or so who gathered on November 26 to "hang the greens" and improve the sound quality in the Sanctuary. We are all set for this joyous season!

You will read about all of the other special things we're doing, on the other pages of this newsletter, so I want to focus on the concept of membership. Jeff Chapman, our moderator, announced on November 27 during worship, that the 2017 Membership Affirmation cards and the Giving Covenant cards are now available for you to complete.

I love this church's approach to membership. In most churches, when you become a member, you're a member for life, or until you withdraw or transfer. The result of this is that every ten years or so, church clerks go into panic "clean up the rolls" mode when they realize there are people on the membership list that no one has seen or heard from in years, and even their contact info in the directory is obsolete. It becomes a big, time-consuming project to update the records to accurately reflect who really is a part of the church.

Here, every member is offered the opportunity to "renew" their membership--to reaffirm their desire and commitment to be a vital part of this body of believers. It keeps things fresh, and it keeps things current. And it keeps membership on our radar, so that when new people become part of what we're doing, we can offer them this step as a further expression that they personally embrace our mission.

Nathan and I became members of this congregation on October 23, our first Sunday with you. We have already now signed and returned our 2017 Membership Affirmation cards, because we are "all in." We love this congregation and its special way of bringing God's realm to this community. Have you? Are you? Do you? Let's do this, together! We would love to have your completed Membership Affirmation cards by Christmas Day, if possible. Consider it a Christmas present to yourself, to God, and to your church community.

## Team Talk

The Administration Team met on November 30, 2016. Members of the Team present were Newman McAllister, Sunde King and Marsha Soyka. Jeff Chapman, Rebecca Wujcik and Pastor Diane Martin also attended. John Schwabe was excused. Newman gave the reflection.

The minutes from the October 26, 2016, meeting were approved without change. The financial report was reviewed. Income exceeded expenses by \$3,557 through October. The team approved obtaining a Sam's Club membership for the church with the \$45 cost to be paid by the Sallie Bush Community Building.

Rebecca reported that the septic tank will be pumped prior to Christmas. The church uses Waste Management for trash service. The team approved switching to lower cost Teller County Trash beginning January 1. The post office boxes that were formerly in the Pastor's study will be presented for silent auction along with the long table now in the bookkeeper's office, should one desire the set. Newman will pursue finding a person to clear the church sidewalks and walkway of snow. Marsha will investigate whether there can be a programmable thermostat that controls the heat in the two offices. The organ needs repair and someone to repair the carillon bells will also be sought. Newman will contact Bob Patchell about installing a small window in the door to the Pastor's study. There are several bulbs out in the choir loft and three halogen types out that illuminate the altar. Newman will pursue. Jeff reported that the four spotlights that illuminate the stained glass windows in the narthex have been repeatedly replaced but always blow out. An electrician may be required. The door leading to the porch in Tatter Hall has large gaps below and around the frame. Newman will purchase weather stripping. Pastor Diane and Rebecca will reformat the church directory, perhaps with photographs.

The Christmas Eve offerings will continue to be paid to the UCC Christmas Fund, to benefit retired ministers. Raises for staff, other than Pastor Diane, were discussed. All existing team members and officers are willing to serve again in 2017, except for John Schwabe. A congregational meeting will be set for January.

Pastor Diane reported that she has developed a visitor information and prayer request card. The team agreed that the red sign-in books in the pews should be removed because they are rarely completed. She also reported extensively on her many activities since the October meeting. The meeting adjourned at 6:30 p.m. The next Team meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, December 21, at 4:45 p.m.

Tuesdays (Dec. 6, 13, 20), 4:30-5:45 p.m.




