Lent Begins March 5 – Let Us Prepare our Hearts for Easter

On Easter, we celebrate the miracle Jesus did for us by rising from the grave and reconciling the world to God. During his lifetime, Jesus performed many other salvific and healing acts, and several of them are recorded only in the Gospel of John. Let us explore, between now and Easter, some of those events. **Pastor Diane will preach an encouraging, uplifting sermon series titled “Only in John: Stories Found Only in John’s Gospel.”** Curious about the topics? Here is the schedule:



- March 5 – John 2.1-11, “Jesus’ First Miracle: The Wedding at Cana”
- March 12 – John 3.1-21, “Jesus’ Secret Conversation with Nicodemus”
- March 19 – John 4:1-29, 39-42, “Jesus’ Forbidden Conversation with the Samaritan Woman at the Well”
- March 26 – John 8:2-11, “Jesus Forgives the Woman Caught in Adultery”
- April 2 – John 11:1-44, “Jesus Raises Lazarus from the Dead” (Rev. Jim Price preaches.)
- April 9 – John 12.12-19, “The People Spread Palm Branches as Jesus Enters Jerusalem” (Palm Sunday)
- April 16 – John 20.1-23, “Jesus Appears First to Mary” (Easter Sunday)

Team Talk

The Administration Team met on February 15, 2017. Members of the team present were Newman McAllister (by Skype), Marsha Soyka, Ian Elliot and Stacey Okvath. Jeff Chapman, Rebecca Wujcik, Sunde King, and Pastor Diane Martin also attended. Marsha gave the reflection. The minutes from the January 25, 2017, meeting were approved, with the addition of Church in the Wildwood to the heading. Financial figures were not yet available for January.

Rebecca reported that she has made a list of all devices in the church that use batteries, including thermostats, with a note to replace them once a year. The website was down for a time but has been reinstated. Ian will repair the broken rope in the bell tower. The metal post office boxes that were formerly in the Pastor’s office were sold to Rod Smith for \$50. The Team agreed there is no need to pay

\$10 per month for the ability to send outgoing faxes – that service will be discontinued. Newman is still out of town, but upon his return he will coordinate with Nathan Martin about looking at repair of electrical system that controls the lights that illuminate the stained glass windows at the rear of the sanctuary. Jeff is still working on a proposal, to be funded by anonymous donors, to improve the wireless listening devices for sermons on Sunday and the purchase of a wireless handheld microphone to be used during worship by congregation members.

The choir took a break in January but is singing again in February. Pastor Diane discussed several revisions to Policy No. 3, the Safe Church Policy. After discussion the matter was tabled for further revisions. Pastor Diane reported extensively on her numerous activities since the last team meeting. Lent begins on March 1. Her Lenten sermon series is entitled “Only in John: Stories Found Only in John’s Gospel.” The meeting adjourned at 6:30 p.m. The next meeting will be Tuesday, March 21, at 4:45 p.m.

The pantry always needs non-perishable food, toiletries, and potatoes. Right now, we especially need **canned tomatoes, jelly, pork ‘n beans, seasonings (including salt and pepper), canned fruit, and powdered milk**. Thank you for your loyal support and contributions to the food pantry.

May 28 – Blackwood Legacy Coming to the Church in the Wildwood!

Coming to us on a love offering basis (no cost to us), from Nashville, Tennessee, is the Blackwood Legacy quartet. Read about them below, but please start inviting all of your friends, co-workers, neighbors and family members to this event, because we want to pack our beautiful sanctuary with guests!

This group will minister during our regular Sunday morning service, on Memorial Day weekend, and you won't want to miss their timeless blend of new country and folk gospel music. Rick Price and Chris Blackwood formed the Blackwood Legacy as a tribute to the legendary music of the Grammy and Dove award-winning group the Blackwood Brothers Quartet.



The Blackwood Legacy is comprised of Rick Price, Luke Yates, Hunter Sparkman and Paul Secord. On tour more than 250 dates per year, they truly demonstrate the love of God through their music, ministry, and testimonies.

Inducted into the Gospel Music Hall of Fame with the Blackwood Brothers, Rick Price has more than 30 years of gospel music under his belt. Believing that "the road to the future is paved with memories of the past," and recognizing the need to reach audiences of all ages, Price has gathered some of the finest musicians on the gospel scene today. He is joined by Luke Yates, a pianist and vocalist originally from the Spokane, Washington area; and tenor Paul Secord, songwriter, musician and worship leader. The group's newest addition is lead singer Hunter Sparkman, a Nashville-based Christian recording artist, songwriter and musician. The Blackwood Legacy was recently signed to Mansion Records and have released several albums under their new label.

July 1-9 – Green Box Arts Festival

Once again, the Church in the Wildwood is hosting the Sacred Music Festival during the Green Box Arts Festival. This year, the Sacred Music Festival will feature a **bluegrass ensemble led by our friend from Colorado College, Keith Reed.**



Keith is the Studio Professor for Bluegrass Music at Colorado College. He grew up playing bluegrass banjo and guitar and, as a professional musician, has done extensive touring and has two critically acclaimed recordings. He is a lecturer and teaches bluegrass guitar, banjo, and bluegrass ensemble at Colorado College in Colorado Springs. Keith is bringing together to

perform with him during Green Box some of the finest bluegrass musicians in the country. These include Ronnie Bowman, Gabe Witcher, Irl Hees, and Don Rigsby.

Watch for more details later, but we can tell you this much already:

- The ensemble will perform an outdoor afternoon concert that is open to everyone, on Saturday afternoon, July 1.
- Then they will play a smaller set in the evening at the Church in the Wildwood. This will include an educational component, during which the musicians will discuss the history of bluegrass and the philosophy behind their styles of playing.
- On Sunday, July 2, the ensemble will perform during our worship service at the Church in the Wildwood, drawing upon the spiritual roots of bluegrass and taking worshippers on a tour of both religious and musical history.
- Then, on Sunday evening, July 2, the Colorado Vocal Arts Ensemble will present a concert, which is also open to the public, in our sanctuary.
- Jim Van Namee will return to teach a four-day photography workshop for middle and high school students. (This is the only youth workshop we are hosting this year, as some events will be taking place at Ute Pass Elementary School.)
