### Holy Week at the Church in the Wildwood

#### **April 9 (Sunday) – Palm Sunday Worship, 10:30 a.m.**

Pastor Diane and the children will parade into church with palm branches and hallelujahs! During Fellowship Time, let's all pitch in and stuff the plastic eggs for the Easter Egg Hunt on Easter Sunday.

#### **April 11 (Tuesday) – Coffee & Conversation, 10:00 a.m.**

Let's gather and reflect on what the resurrection means for us today.

**April 13 – Maundy Thursday Worship, Community Congregational Church in Manitou Springs, 7:00 p.m.** As last year, our sister congregation invites us to worship with them on this holy evening.

#### **April 14 – Good Friday Worship, 7:00 p.m.**

Come and relive the somber tones of the crucifixion and the tomb. We'll hear a reading from Fulton Oursler's book *The Greatest Story Ever Told* and a brief sermon by Pastor Diane, and we will leave in silence after the altar is stripped bare.

**9:00 a.m. – Breakfast.** Please come for our traditional Easter breakfast of Southwestern casserole and sausage. After you eat, please plan to help us hide Easter eggs throughout the building.

## Team Talk

The Administration Team met on March 21, 2017. Members of the Team present were Newman McAllister, Marsha Soyka and Sunde King. Ian Elliot, Stacey Okvath, and Rebecca Wujcik were excused. Jeff Chapman and Pastor Diane Martin also attended. Jeff gave the reflection.

The minutes from the February 15 meeting were approved, with one correction – the proposed wireless microphone is for the use of the congregation. Expenses have exceeded income through February in the sum of \$10,910.

Nathan Martin repaired the electrical system that controls the lights that illuminate the stained glass windows at the rear of the sanctuary. Nathan also changed all the burned-out light bulbs in the church, replacing them with those that are energy-efficient, and installed dimmer switches for the large circular sanctuary lights. Ian is to replace the sanctuary bell rope and will be asked to develop a fire emergency plan for the church. Newman reported that Jim Dunkley inspected the boiler system and thermostats recently after a complaint of uncontrolled high temperature in Tatter Hall. He found no defects but a zone valve is leaking: he will repair it in the summer. Jeff is still working on a proposal, to be funded by anonymous donors, to improve the wireless listening devices for sermons on Sundays and the purchase of a wireless microphone for use of the congregation during worship. Marsha will inspect the two exhaust fans in the kitchen and one in the sanctuary. Stacey and Alvin Okvath donated the coat racks near the sanctuary entry. Pastor Diane will look into new entryway doormats. Pastor Diane is still revising the Safe Church Policy and it was tabled. The pictorial church directly should be printed soon.

Andrea Wixo and Teresa Legarski are representatives of newly formed Girl Scout Troop 46286. They appeared along with Jonathan Dooley, the Cubmaster. The Troop was granted permission to meet at the church on the same schedule as the Cub Scouts – from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m. on every Monday when school is in session, beginning April 10. They will primarily use the large room above Lower Fellowship Hall. They will begin with about 12 girls.

Marsha reported that Church Mutual, the church's casualty and liability insurance company, is offering free, for three years, sensors to be installed in the church to detect frozen or broken water lines, or the incursion of surface water. The Team approved the project, and Marsha will superintend. The Green Box Arts Festival wants to display their large furnished dollhouse on the stage in Tatter Hall from mid-November through January. The Team approved the project, conditioned upon the Festival insuring the dollhouse against casualty loss, and with a waiver from the Festival that would protect the church in the event displayed items are damaged or missing, through no fault of the church. The Team discussed developing a fee schedule for the rental of the church to members and the public for meetings, dinners and receptions. Newman will investigate what Sallie Bush and the Chipita Park Association charge.

The quarterly congregational meeting will be held immediately after morning worship on April 23.

Pastor Diane reported extensively on her numerous activities since the last Team meeting. She is encouraging all members to attend the special Southeastern Association workshop at the church on April 29, from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. The subject is "How to Use: Online Tools to Engage with the World." She discussed the church's worship schedule during Easter.

The meeting adjourned at 6:40 p.m. The next meeting will be on Tuesday, April 18, at 4:45 p.m.

Coming to us on a love offering basis (no cost to us), from Nashville, Tennessee, is the Blackwood Legacy quartet. This group will minister during our regular Sunday morning service, on Memorial Day weekend, and you won't want to miss their timeless blend of new country and folk gospel music. Rick Price and Chris Blackwood formed the Blackwood Legacy as a tribute to the legendary music of the Grammy and Dove award-winning group the Blackwood Brothers Quartet.



The Blackwood Legacy is comprised of Rick Price, Luke Yates, Hunter Sparkman and Paul Secord. On tour more than 250 dates per year, they truly demonstrate the love of God through their music, ministry, and testimonies.

Inducted into the Gospel Music Hall of Fame with the Blackwood Brothers, Rick Price has more than 30 years of gospel music under his belt. Believing that "the road to the future is paved with memories of the past," and recognizing the need to reach audiences of all ages, Price has gathered some of the finest musicians on the gospel scene today. He is joined by Luke Yates, a pianist and vocalist originally from the Spokane, Washington area; and tenor Paul Secord, songwriter, musician and worship leader. The group's newest addition is lead singer Hunter Sparkman, a Nashville-based Christian recording artist, songwriter and musician. The Blackwood Legacy was recently signed to Mansion Records and have released several albums under their new label.

## July 1-9 – Green Box Arts Festival

Once again, the Church in the Wildwood is hosting the Sacred Music Festival during the Green Box Arts Festival. This year, the Sacred Music Festival will feature a **bluegrass ensemble led by our friend from Colorado College, Keith Reed.**



Keith is the Studio Professor for Bluegrass Music at Colorado College. He grew up playing bluegrass banjo and guitar and, as a professional musician, has done extensive touring and has two critically acclaimed recordings. He is a lecturer and teaches bluegrass guitar, banjo, and bluegrass ensemble at Colorado College in Colorado Springs. Keith is bringing together to perform with him during Green Box some of the finest bluegrass musicians in the country. These include Ronnie Bowman, Gabe Witcher, Irl Hees, and Don Rigsby.

Watch for more details later, but we can tell you this much already:

- The ensemble will perform an outdoor afternoon concert that is open to everyone, on Saturday afternoon, July 1.
- Then they will play a smaller set in the evening at the Church in the Wildwood. This will include an educational component, during which the musicians will discuss the history of bluegrass and the philosophy behind their styles of playing.
- On Sunday, July 2, the ensemble will perform during our worship service at the Church in the Wildwood, drawing upon the spiritual roots of bluegrass and taking worshippers on a tour of both religious and musical history.
- Then, on Sunday evening, July 2, the Colorado Vocal Arts Ensemble will present a concert, which is also open to the public, in our sanctuary.
- Jim Van Namee will return to teach a four-day photography workshop for middle and high school students. (This is the only youth workshop we are hosting this year, as some events will be taking place at Ute Pass Elementary School.)
