

NEW HAVEN - Sharpshooting Eddie Griffin triggered a brilliant second quarter attack which carried impressive Hartford High to a 74-61 victory over rival Bulkeley Tuesday night in a Connecticut Interscholastic Ath-letic Conference Class A basketball tournament playdown game at the Arena.
