By FRANK CLINE Hartford High, defending city champion, salvaged a share of that crown, by easily whipping outclassed Weaver, 27-6, in their annual Thanksgiving Day clash at Municipal Stadium yesterday. A capacity crowd of 6,700 fans watched the one-sided contest played under perfect weather conditions. Ironically enough, the city title race this year ended as deadlock-ed as it could possibly get. Hart-ford and Bulkeley battled to a 6-6 tie last Saturday and the Owls and Maroons both trimmed the third member of this trio, Weav-er. by identical scores, 27-6. The final score yesterday ac-tually isn't indicative of Hart-ford's superiority in the 32nd re-newal of this annual rivarly. Hart-ford led 20-0 at half time and Owl coach Ralph Worth played a com-bination of first stringers and re-serves during most of the second half.

"Kas" dove over the line for a yard on the third play of the sec-ond period for his first tally and ripped eight yards through the middle of the Weaver line in the third period for the Owls' final touchdown of the game. Big Mike Gozzo wa s credited with two points when he ackled Weaver quarterback Spencer Rohrlick in the end zone in the second period. Al Smith aided Gozzo on the tackle but Gozzo made the initial contact and was credited with the safety. Weaver scored its only touch down in the final period against Owl reserves. A fumble, an Owl bugaboo all season, set it up. Dom DiCicco pounced on the Owls' fifth fumble of the day on the Hartford 20 yard line. The Owls conceded the short ones but were always on the alert when Rorhlick went for the TD with a long one. Hartford, with the victory, ended up with a record of four wins, three defeats and a tie. The coaching combination of Worth and Frank Scelza have yet to have a losing season at Hartford. Weaver lost its seventh decision in eight games this fall. Of the 382 yards Hartford pick-ed up on the ground, Gustafson and Kaselouskas accounted for 227 of it between them. . Gus-tafson g a in ed 155 alone while his running mate picked up 72....
