

NEW BRITAIN - Hartford Public's overpowering track team easily captured top honors in the 42nd Annual CIAC Track met Monday afternoon at Central Connecticut's Arute Field.
With first place efforts from Pablo Franco in the 100 yard dash. Charlie Vann in the 220, Ted Rush in the triple jump and the 880 relay team, Hartford piled up a total of 39 points in a field of the state's best track competitors. Windsor was second with 19 points.

Two Marks Set, One Tied

There were two meet records set and one tied. Pulaski's gi-gantic jackin thrower, Jackie Hand ripped off a 238'8" heave beating his brothers' 1968 record

by 18 feet.
