## Mike Curry Brilliant in Finale: Hartford Wins Team Track Title

FAIRFIELD Mike FAIRFIELD — Mike Curry capped a brilliant career with his usual doublewin style and hurdling power Hartford Public snatched high school track's top team title to highlight Saturday's State Open meet at Roger Ludlowe High School.

Triple jumper Bob Woods the only state record,
i jumper Dave Arnold high and pole vaulter Ken Appel set meet records and Newington weightman Karl Swanke shared double-win-ner status with Bulkeley's Curry as the meets top individuals.

Hartford Public scored 78 points — none in the seven field events — to finish points — none in the seven field events — to finish ahead of city rival Bulkeley with 50 points. It was the Owls' seventh open title. In the past nine years the Owls have won either open or Class titles or both.

"It'll be a while before we're back," said Owls' head coach, Lindy Remigino of his almost total senior team. -.

Curry, muscular 6-1, 180-lb. senior headed headed for Boston College with Swanke, swept to expected victories in the 100 and 220 dashes for a third straight year. He won the 100 in :09.8 seconds and the 220 in :22.0. He also anchored Bulkeley's victorious 440 relay team.

Although he began his an-Although he began his anchor leg three yards behind Hartford Public's Jim Nealy, he caught up and won by a stride.

Woods, 6-3, 170-lb. senior at Hillhouse of New Haven who 'Tech, will attend Tennessee Tech, wiped out the ten-year-old triple jump record by % of an inch. His record jump, on his second attempt, was 48' 54".

Woods first cracked the 48-foot barrier last week at the Class 'L' State Meet at Windham High School. "I guess I was juiced up. But

Appel, a senior at Amity of Woodbridge, fell one inch short of breaking his own state record in the pole vault set last week in Southington. His 14' 5½" vault, however, was good enough to break the former meet record by seven inches.

Swanke, 6-6, 230-lb.s, won his specialty, the discus, with a 170-foot toss — 9½ feet ahead of second place Jeff Mather of Windham — Jen Mather of Windham — and he took the shot put by a 2½-foot margin over Fitch of Groton's Bill Borden. Swanke's throw was 58' 3". He also placed fifth with a 179' 4½" toss in the javelin. He led Newington to a third place finish with 32 points

place finish with 32 points. Eric Allain, Connecticut's best javelin thrower the past two years, won with a super-lative effort of 214' 4" on his

last throw. Allain, a senior at Hand of Madison headed for Florida State said," It was my last

throw as a high school competitor in the state. If my arm went out, I wouldn't have cared. I'm overwhelmed.

The battle for the team title was strictly a Hartford affair.

Hartford Public and Bulkeley combined for seven firsts and five seconds in the 17-event competition. The Owls' triumph — as it was last week in the Class "LL" championship — was cornerstoned on the two hurdling events. Although Nealy got a poor start in the 120 high's, a still managed a second poor start in the 120 high's, he still managed a second place finish behind Craig Roman of Norwalk's Brien McMahon. Nealy, a junior, beat Roman by nearly five yards in the LL meet. Teammate Walter Oates nailed third place. In the 330 mate Walter Oates nailed down third place. In the 330 Intermediates, Jerry Dudley beat Nealy to the wire for a 1-2 Hartford Public finish. The Owls got 32 of their 78 points in the hurdles. Owls' also won the mile relay in 3:21.2, the mile and 440.

He began the Owls' 440 relay team that placed second to Bulkeley and the little senior placed second in the 100.

'Adams isn't all the way back," said Remigino after Adams' slow leadoff leg?. "But," said Remigino smil ing, probably realizing then he had the meet won, "at least he can do something."

And Hartford Public was something as usual Saturday.
