A Victory for the High School Boys.

The High school foot ball eleven easily vanquished the New Haven Hillhouse school team in the game on the Ward street grounds in this city on Saturday forenoon. The score was 38 to nothing. The High school boys claim the championship of the state among preparatory schools, for the third year. They have played and won five games this year, making 107 points and losing 22. Saturday's game was a very friendly one throughout. During the game touchdowns were made as follows: Dunferth 3, Corbin 2, Stiles 1, Chamberlain 1 and Warner 1. From three of these touchdowns goals were made. Mr. Miller of Trinity, N.Y. acted as referee and gave his decisions promptly and impartially. The game was witnessed by about 150 people, including a number of ladies. After the game both teams were treated to a nice spread given by some of the young ladies of this Hartford school, after which they held a social session in the High school hall. Later in the afternoon the Hartford boys showed their guests around the city, and took them to the skating rink at the invitation of the managers, Messrs. Clough & Rodgers.
