Hartford had the southern goal in the first half. Suffield kicked off and Hartford began rushing the ball down the field and in about three minutes Hart made a touchdown, but the try at goal was unsuccessful.

Suffield kicked off again and Strong caught the ball. Hartford made steady gains, carrying the ball down the grid-iron, resulting in a touchdown by Strong. The goal was kicked by Johnson.

Suffield again kicked off and Granger in trying to tackle the runner received a blow in the face, which broke his nose and forced him to leave the field. Hastings took his place. Hartford made long gains and Dwyer carried the ball across the goal line, but it was not counted a touchdown on account of off-side play and the ball was given to Suffield, who punted. Seyma made a touchdown, and Johnson kicked the goal, making the score 17 to 0.

Suffield kicked off again and Hartford worked the ball along down the field in good gains. Allen then made a run of thirty yards around right end and scored a touchdown. The goal was kicked by Johnson. Again Suffield kicked off and Hartford pushed the ball down the field at a lively pace. Altogether it took only one minute from the kickoff to the touchdown. Johnson kicked the goal. A double pass gained another touchdown. The goal was kicked by Johnson.

Suffield kicked off. Allen made a long run and a touchdown. This was quite a record, for only thirty seconds elapsed from the time the ball was put in play by the kickoff to the scoring of the touchdown. Johnson kicked the goal. In the second half touchdowns were made by Barrows, Hart (2), Lycett, Jordan and French made a touchdown.

There are this year seven schools in the Connecticut Interscholastic Football Association. New Britain had the good fortune to be the odd school and played no championship game Saturday. Hartford will meet it next Saturday on Electric field, New Britain. The Hartford team is strong and may win. Certainly New Britain will not roll up such a score as last year. If Hartford wins, it will meet the champions of the southern league, probably Hillhouse.

**Hartford High Football Team Won By Score of 73 to 0.**

The football game between the Hartford Public High School and the Connecticut Literary Institution of Suffield played on Trinity field Saturday resulted in an overwhelming victory for Hartford and a disastrous whitewash for Suffield, the final score being Hartford 73, Suffield 0. The right to wear monograms was given to all who played, as this game was in the championship series.
