

# H. P. H. S. IS CHAMPION

## Winner in Trinity Interscholastic Football League.

### TUFTS WINS FROM TRINITY, SCORE, 21 TO 0.

Columbia Meets and Administers a Defeat to University of Pennsylvania—Yale Dies Military Academy.

A crowd of people Saturday witnessed one of the best interscholastic football games ever played on Trinity Field. Boardman Manual Training School of New Haven and Hartford High School met in the final game for the championship of the Trinity League. Hartford won the game 22 to 5. Boardman won the toss and gave the kick-off to Hartford. The local boys chose the south goal with the wind against them. Twichell kicked off for Hartford to Ireland on the ten-yard line, who gained ten yards but was stopped by a fine tackle by H. Costello. Green, by falling through tackle, stretched his length out for five yards. Gorman failed to gain around right end, and on the next play Messinger punted to Barrows on the forty-five-yard line. He returned five yards and followed with five more

through center. W. Costello made five through tackle, Bartlett gained five and H. Costello went around left end for fifteen yards. With the trick tackle play White made five yards more. Boardman held for downs and Sherman made twelve yards at left end and Messinger made five through tackle. Hartford obtained the ball on downs, Twichell fumbled but Bartlett fell on the ball and made six yards on a trick play and Barrows, Bartlett and H. Costello made gains. W. Costello followed with ten yards around right end. After a short gain by Barrows, H. Costello then went around left and to the one-yard line. Hartford failed to gain at center and on the next play made a costly fumble, Boardman falling on the ball. Green made five yards through tackle and Sherman, behind good interference, made twenty-five yards through the entire team, but was stopped by a fine tackle by Twichell. Messinger failed to gain at center and Hartford got the ball on a fumble. Bartlett and H. Costello made good gains. Boardman was then penalized ten yards for offside play. Bartlett made four yards and H. Costello circled left end for twelve yards for a touchdown. Twichell failed at a difficult goal. Score, 5 to 0.

Messinger kicked off to Barrows on the three-yard line. He gained twenty yards before being downed and on the trick tackle play Bartlett made twenty-five yards more. Barrows then punted

Barrows fell on the ball. On the tackle play White ran twenty yards around right end and Bartlett went through tackle for eight more. H. Costello and Barrows made substantial gains. Boardman then held for downs and obtained the ball. By fine tackling by McKone and Ingraham and the blocking of McKough, Hartford quickly regained the ball on downs and at once began to push it down the field. H. Costello, Ingraham, White, W. Costello carrying

the ball for repeated gains. W. Costello was then pushed over for a touch-down. Twichell kicked the goal. Score, 17 to 5.

Messinger kicked to W. Costello on the five-yard line, who returned twenty yards before he was stopped. H. Costello made seven yards and on a trick play Ingraham made twenty yards. Bartlett and Costello followed with gains. Here Gladwin replaced Bartlett and Delabarre replaced H. Costello. Boardman then held for downs, but on obtaining the ball immediately fumbled, Twichell falling on it. Gladwin and W. Costello advanced the ball and then Twichell made a thrilling drop kick while surrounded by opponents, the ball passing neatly over the cross bar. This made the score 22 to 5. With an exchange of punts the game ended with the ball in Boardman's possession in the middle of the field. The line-up:—

#### High School Boys Celebrate.

The high school boys commemorated their victory by a large bonfire Saturday night. Mayor Harrison issued a permit for the boys to celebrate, so a large quantity of wood was collected in the vacant lot on the corner of Hopkins and Asylum street. When the fire was lighted the 150 boys danced around it, gave the school songs and cheers and burned a quantity of colored fire. The light from the fire could be seen for some distance against the sky. A number of Boardman fellows who missed the 7:10 train, appeared and gave their yells for Hartford's High.

#### Yale and West Point Tie.

West Point, N. Y., Nov. 3.—West Point scored on Yale yesterday for the first time in years, and the game ended 5 to 5. The Yale line, heavy and fast, could do little with the cadets. Charles D. Daly, former Harvard captain, played quarterback for West Point and did great work. Yale never seriously threatened West Point's goal except in the first half, when, with three minutes to play, Weymouth was shoved over the line for a touch-down, after the ball had been brought to the army's five-yard line by hard rushes through the line. Yale failed at goal, and the half ended with the ball on Yale's thirty-yard line in her possession.

The second half the Yale backs stood up well and their interference was excellent, but invariably a cadet would get through and break up the blue offense and null the runner for a loss. Yale fumbled throughout the half, and West Point held for downs several times, and did not lose the ball more than once for this reason. The cadet guards and center were remarkably strong, and Yale's only gains were by the tackle-back play through the opposing tackles.

Daly's generalship was the feature of the game. Three times he tried for goals at difficult angles in the second half, and at last made one as prettily as ever was kicked from the thirty-five-yard line, tying the score. Yale fought hard, and there was some improvement in the offensive work, but all efforts to gain ground were fruitless, and the ball rested on Yale's ten-yard line in their possession when the half ended. #### Tufts 21, Trinity 0.

Medford, Nov. 2.—Tufts defeated its old rival, Trinity, yesterday afternoon 21 to 0. It was the big game of the year for Tufts. Trinity expected to win, but was outplayed. Once only, in the second half, did Trinity gain first down. On the offense Tufts showed ability to gain ground consecutively, and long runs were frequent. Knight made a seventy-yard run from kick-off in the second half, and Clement scored a touchdown in a sensational ninety-five-yard sprint near the close of the first half behind excellent interference. The Trinity men were in poor condition and several of them were frequently laid out, causing a considerable delay in the game. The line-up:—

to Green, who fumbled. Bartlett fell on the ball and Bartlett made eight yards and Costello gained twelve more at left end. Boardman then held for downs. McKone tackled Gorman for a loss and Barrows downed Messinger, who gained eight yards. Costello and McKone then tackled O'Brien after gaining eight yards. Hartford obtained the ball on downs and White made eight yards through tackle and Bartlett made twenty-five yards around left end, carrying the ball to Boardman's five-yard line. Here Boardman again held for downs and Messinger punted to the middle of the field to Twichell, who fumbled and Sherman fell on the ball. Green made three yards through tackle but Ingraham made a beautiful tackle on an end play, preventing a gain. Green made several gains. Gorman failed to gain and Green again made gains amounting to nine yards. As time was nearly up Messinger dropped back for a try at goal. The ball was passed and he kicked a beautiful drop from the thirty-yard line which passed squarely between the goal posts. This tied the score, 5 to 5. Barrows punted out from the twenty-five-yard line to Sherman, who failed to gain. With a little more playing the half ended with the ball in Boardman's possession on Hartford's forty-five-yard line.

After a ten-minute interval Messinger kicked off to the five-yard line. Barrows caught and returned twenty yards. Ingraham, Barrows, W. Costello, H. Costello and White made repeated gains. Barrows bucked the line for five yards more and Henry Costello then made two runs of ten yards each around left end. White made three yards through tackle, when Boardman again made a magnificent brace and Hartford could not advance a yard, the visitors getting the ball on downs. They failed to gain at center, so Messinger punted out to Barrows on the twenty-yard line. H. Costello, Barrows and Costello made gains, carrying the ball to the one-yard line. White was pushed over for a touchdown. Twichell kicked the goal. Score, 11 to 5.

Boardman kicked off to W. Costello on the ten-yard line. He fumbled but
