

# Hartford High Piles Up Record Score In Beating Aggie's Second Eleven

**"Shrimp" Foley is Big Factor in 90 to 7 Victory, Racing  
 For Five Touchdowns Through Broken Fields—  
 School Team Displays Brilliant Open Game.**

What was scheduled for a football game between the Hartford High School and the Connecticut Aggie second team yesterday afternoon turned out to be a track meet in which every member of the Hartford High squad was put into the game against the Aggies. The score was 90 to 7 in favor of the high school. "Shrimp" Foley, clever little captain, was the star of the afternoon. He started on the kick-off when the Aggies kicked to him on his 50-yard line, recovering the ball and racing for a touchdown. "Shrimp" was the terror of the visitors throughout the game. He intercepted forward passes galore and ran them down for touchdowns.

**Barclay Also Stars.**

Second only to Foley was "Jerry" Barclay, the bulky Hartford fullback. In addition to scoring two touchdowns Barclay kicked every goal save one which was tried in the teeth of a brisk gale. "Jerry" plunged through the seething line for repeated gains and on one occasion ran the ball twenty-five yards around the end on a tumble.

Peterson was the star for the Aggies and scored their only touchdown. Immediately after Foley scored on the kick-off the Aggies took the ball and ran it down the field for a score on steady plunges. Thereafter the locals tore loose and walked away with the game. The first quarter ended with a score of 7 to 7.

In the second quarter Escholtz started off with a touchdown for Hartford and immediately after Foley scored another after a twenty-five-yard run. The locals opened up their log of tricks and Baron, Hartford guard, who was made eligible to receive a pass, scooped in one of Barclay's offerings and ran it for another touchdown. The first half closed with a score of 23 to 7.

**Foley Scores Again.**

The third quarter opened with Foley pulling another forty-yard run for a touchdown. The game was beginning to be just one touchdown after another by this time. Barclay scored the next touchdown and kicked his own goal. Goodman, who had been put in for McCoy, ran off two brilliant end runs, which resulted in his scoring a touchdown. The quarter ended 40 to 7.

Drolet scored the next and Barclay failed to kick the goal. Foley intercepted one of the Aggie's passes and ran it thirty yards for a touchdown. Immediately after he intercepted another pass and ran it eighty yards for another touchdown. The ball was kicked off to the Aggies and they promptly fumbled it. Fay recovered it and on the next play scooped in a forward pass from Barclay and ran it twenty yards before he was downed on the Aggie's 5-yard line. He received another pass behind the Aggie's goal but because he caught it behind the ten-yard back line it was not counted as a touchdown. From then on the locals confined themselves to aerial work letting loose pass after pass until Goodman scored another touchdown. Goodman intercepted an Aggie pass immediately after and ran forty yards for another touchdown.

The last touchdown of the game was scored by Barclay, who intercepted an Aggie pass and ran fifty yards for a touchdown, then kicked his goal as the game ended.
