

# Hartford High Displays Offensive Power and Sweeps to Victory Over New Haven. 14 to 7

## HILLHOUSE ELEVEN FIGHTS HARD BUT IS OUTCLASSED

### Local Backs Twist Their Way Through For Long Gains.

Showing a reversal of form over last week's game in Meriden, the Hartford High gridiron team swept its way to a clean cut 14 to 7 victory over the New Haven Hillhouse High eleven, and thereby went into a tie with New Britain High for leading honors in the Triangular League.

One of the largest crowds of the season gathered to see the schoolboy classic and it was afforded with all the thrills a real gridiron battle should give. Forward passes, end runs, drop kicks and some pretty line plugging were reeled off.

**New Haven Starts Fast.**  
 The New Haven team displayed a wonderful fighting attack in the first quarter and scored its only touchdown on a forward pass near the center of the field. After the opening period the Elm City team lost all its pep and never threatened to score.

Captain Embler, New Haven High fullback, was the outstanding star of the visiting aggregation. He made some fine end runs, while New Haven had the ball and on the defensive he was the whole works. Time and again he broke up Hartford High tackle plays by his phenomenal tackling. Embler was injured in the third period and was taken to the hospital. He had a broken nose and sustained many cuts on his face.

**A Different H. H. S. Team.**  
 It looked like a different team that represented the Blue and White yesterday afternoon. The old fighting spirit was there and it was this that kept the ball in Hartford's possession during the last three periods.

The Hartford High backfield lunged and twisted its way through the New Haven line, after the end of the first quarter, in a clock-like fashion. Baron tore off yard after yard by his terrific smashes at the line. In the last period he intercepted a New Haven forward pass and ran ten yards before being downed. Bush went like a whirlwind at left halfback. He made some fine gains on off-tackle plays and kicked two pretty drop kicks for the point after touchdowns. Herling as usual put in his ear for the Blue and White. Twice he brought the ball to the goal line after a flashy run.

**Line Works Well.**  
 The line play of the locals was

far superior to last week. Smith, in the center plugged up all chance of advance and Walkinson and Ahern took care of the tackle berths in wonderful style.

After a short delay New Haven kicked off to Hartford High with the wind at its back. The ball surged back and forth for about half the period and then Roberts grabbed off a forward pass and raced forty yards for a touchdown. Larson kicked the goal and the score read: New Haven High 7, Hartford High 0. The quarter ended with the ball in Hartford's possession.

In the second period the Hartford High team took a new lease of life and after a sixty-yard march down the field, Baron crossed the goal line. Bush booted a drop kick. The locals had the ball on New Haven's 5-yard line in the same canto but were held. The half saw a tie score and the crowd on edge.

**No Setup in Attack.**  
 But there was no letup to the Hartford High attack. Hartford kicked off and soon New Haven was forced to punt. Mixing up line plays and forward passes, the locals again were able to score, Baron doing the stunt for the second time. Bush's toe again acted on good behavior and the score was 14 to 7 in favor of Hartford.

In the final period it was the same story and when the final whistle blew the ball was on the New Haven 2-yard line. The summary:—
