

# Hartford High Attack Nets Four Touchdowns To Beat Bulkeley Eleven 25 to 0

## 'Hayden To Cunningham' Air Combine Bewilders Losers

**Bulkeley Crumples After Farrell Is Forced to Retire in Second Period—Kenny Hits Line For Big Gains—Andrews and Gallivan Show Well**

Flashing an aerial attack that could not be stopped, Hartford High ran roughshod over Bulkeley 25 to 0, at Bulkeley Stadium yesterday. The Hartford crumples, Hayden and Cunningham, were in the lineup and had the Bulkeley boys dizzy with forward passes. The Bulkeley team was weakened in the second period when they lost Farrell and put up a very ragged defense.

Bulkeley had things its own way in the first period. With Mondon and Farrell carrying the ball, they ripped the Hartford line to pieces but did not have the added punch to score. The ball was in Bulkeley's possession most of the time and they kept it in Hartford's territory and continually threatened to score. They lost a good chance to score when LeRoy fumbled and the ball was recovered by Cutler on the 10 yard line. The period ended with the ball on Hartford's 20 yard line and in Bulkeley's possession.

It was in the second period that Hartford flashed its strong attack and scored two touchdowns. Bulkeley lost the ball, when Ward intercepted a forward pass and brought the ball to Hartford's 40 yard line. On the next play Hayden took the ball through the line for 20 yards. Three more line plays were tried with no gain and Hayden kicked. Bulkeley lost the ball for downs on its own 40 yard line. With Kenny carrying the ball Hartford advanced the ball to Bulkeley's 27 yard line.

On the next play Hartford got a lucky break. Hayden threw a pass to Cunningham which he fumbled and recovered on Bulkeley's 2 yard line. On the next play Kenny went through the end for the touchdown. They were unsuccessful for the extra point. The second touchdown came a few minutes later when Hartford received the ball on Bulkeley's 43 yard line. Hayden threw a pass to Cunningham which put the ball on Bulkeley's 13 yard line. On two line plunges with Kenny carrying the ball, they advanced the ball to Bulkeley's 5 yard line and Kenny threw a pass to Hayden for the touchdown. Hayden missed the kick for the extra point.

The third period brought no scoring, but Hartford was the complete master of the situation and kept the ball in Bulkeley's territory and Bulkeley was forced to kick often to keep the ball out of danger. Gallivan scored a touchdown from midfield which did not count on account of holding in the line. Bulkeley threatened to score, when they worked the ball down to Hartford's 10 yard line and a pass from Corado to Taksar put the ball on Hartford's five yard line and with four successive line plunges they could only advance the ball to Hartford's one yard line and the quarter ended with the ball in Hartford's possession on its own one yard line.

On the first play in the last quarter, Bulkeley was penalized 15 yards, which put the ball on Hartford's 16-yard line. On the next play, Gallivan made 10 yards on an end run and made another 30 yards through the line. On the next play with Andrews

carrying the ball, Hartford advanced to the 30-yard line. Kenny threw another pass to Hayden who scored his second touchdown of the game. Hayden missed the kick for the extra point. Coach Newell used a lot of substitutes in the last of the game and they all made a good showing.

In the kick-off after the touchdown, Bulkeley fumbled the ball and Hartford made a touchback. The ball was put on Bulkeley's 30-yard line and on a line plunge with Andrews carrying the ball they advanced it to Bulkeley's 10-yard line. On the next play Andrews took the ball over for a touchdown. Hogan, who replaced Cunningham on the line was successful in the kick for the extra point. Hartford threatened to score again a few minutes later when Gallivan intercepted a pass and brought the ball to midfield. Andrews dashed around right end for 40 yards and the game ended with the ball on Bulkeley's 10-yard line.

Mondon was the best yard gainer for Bulkeley. Cerasole played his usual good game and it was his good defense work that kept Hartford from scoring more. The loss of Farrell broke up the strong backfield offense they had been using and the shifting of the players weakened the line.

Tommy Hayden was the outstanding star of the game. His passing put the Hartford team in scoring position and his perfect interference aided Kenny and Ward in several long gains. Kenny was the surest yard gainer for Hartford and his two passes to Hayden accounted for two touchdowns. Cunningham played a good game at end and in spite of a bad leg made several long runs. Ward, Andrews and Gallivan did good work in the backfield. The line, which showed weakness in the first period held like a stone wall for the rest of the game and gave the backfield line protection.
