Enfield has shot, but Simsbury wins

WEST HARTFORD — With seconds remaining, the Enfield hockey team played with urgency. Even with the puck stuck in their zone and their goalie pulled for an extra skater, the Raiders didn't collapse. So it was fitting that Simsbury's 5-4 CIAC Division I first-round victory ended with a shot on goal. As time ran out Wednesday, Simsbury goalie Randy Wachtel made a save on a slap shot from near the Enfield goal by freshman Fred Seagrave, who had a hat trick. But it took an outstanding game from Simsbury's No. 1 line — juniors David Veisor and Will Hayes and sophomore Mike Hood — to avoid an upset. Hayes and Hood each had two goals, and Veisor scored the winner with 3 minutes, 53 seconds left on a setup by Hood. "They never gave up," first-year Enfield coach Chris Kiene said. "A few breaks, or maybe if we didn't make a few mistakes, and we win. But Simsbury is well-coached and we really needed to be perfect to beat them."

But Simsbury, third-ranked in the tournament, wouldn't roll over No. 14 Enfield, which had eight freshmen in its lineup. Enfield managed to hang close because of two players, Seagrave and junior goalie Rudy Arthofer. First, Seagrave. The freshman drew a crowd each time he touched the puck, especially after scoring two goals in the first period. After Hood gave Simsbury a 1-0 lead 6 minutes, 3 seconds into the game, Seagrave scored twice in the final 5:08 of the first period. He scored off a rebound after winning the faceoff in the left circle in front of the Simsbury net. With 1:15 left, Seagrave skated past the defense, held the puck until Wachtel went down, then lifted a wrist shot off the crossbar and in. "[Seagrave] lifted himself to a higher level and was outstanding," Kiene said. Arthofer (38 saves) was equally impressive. Hood's first goal came off a pileup in the crease. The net appeared to dislodge as the puck slid past Arthofer. Simsbury scored three goals in the second period — the first when Arthofer lost his stick, the second on a three-on-one, and the third on the power play. After Seagrave scored on a shot from the point at 12:30 of the third, Arthofer kept it close with a sprawling save on Veisor, who took a cross pass and had an open net. "He made a lot of good saves,"

said defenseman Jeremy Pepin, the only senior on Enfield. "That helped a lot. It really kept us going and kept us in. We just couldn't put one in. Until 5-foot-2, 100-pound sophomore Jim McGlynn hit the ice. With

6:52 left, Enfield tied it when McGlynn — playing his first shift of the game — scored off a rebound. But with Seagrave in the penalty box, Veisor scored off a two-on-one. Enfield never threatened again.

After lapse, Ellington rolls in Class M

ELLINGTON — Randi Jones sat on the bench, watching her team struggle. She leaned back. She leaned forward. She sat with her chin in her hands, elbows resting on her knees as she stared intently at the game unfolding in front of her. But no vibes from the sideline would make the ball go into the basket for Ellington. "It was frustrating to watch, cause you want to be out there helping your team," said Jones, who was pulled out for taking an ill-advised three-pointer. "We were totally out of our game." A half-time talk from coach Bill Fortin was all it took to get Ellington back in the game. The Purple

Knights regained control in the third quarter and coasted to a 63-32 CIAC Class M girls basketball tournament victory over Middletown. Ellington (19-3) plays Northwest Catholic-West Hartford Friday in the quarterfinals at a site to be announced. Middletown ended its season 16-6. Ahead 21-4 after the first quarter, Ellington came out flat in the second. Middletown's Amy Amenta scored the first basket, followed by a Karen Rothe free throw for Ellington. Middletown then scored the next 12 points — six by Stacey Viarengo — before allowing Cheri Belanger's basket with 1 minute, 24 seconds remaining. Viarengo's basket with 32 seconds left brought the Blue Dragons to within 24-20.

"We weren't watching key people," Fortin said. "Our inside game was good, then we got away from it. I told them we should be better than a four-point lead at halftime. We needed to be more patient and work on their weaknesses. I said we shouldn't let this be our last game." The Purple Knights outscored Middletown 21-4, led by seven points from Jones, who finished with a team-high 17. Ellington forced seven turnovers as Middletown had difficulty handling the full-court press. Throughout the third quarter, point guard Cheri Belanger and Jones worked the ball into the lane to either Heather Stone (12 points) or Jacy-Lynn Baiocchi (14), who drove the baseline for layups or tookshort jumpers. "In the third, they were making everything," said Viarengo, who

scored 16 points. "In the second, we did everything right and we got confidence. In the third, we weren't doing everything right, and then we lost it." Trailing 45-24 going into the fourth, Middletown continued to have problems handling Ellington's defense. Ellington, which lost in the second round last year to Haddam-Killingworth, did what was necessary to hold on. "Our offense was controlled, and we were able to make crisp passes," Jones said. "Everyone worked as a team. We all connected and were able to pull it out. "We want it. We're ready for whatever it's going to be. It's a totally different ballgame out here this year than it was last year. We can go inside, we can go outside, and it's most likely to go in the hoop."
